Activity

This week, we compared the Christian worldview to naturalism, new spirituality, Islam, and postmodernism. As a family, review what each worldview teaches about right and wrong.

Christianity: Right and wrong are Truth. Right is anything that goes along with who God is and wrong is anything that goes against His good design. No one can always do what is right. This is called sin. Sin separates us from God. Jesus came to Earth to live the perfect life we could never live, die on the cross in our place, and rise from the dead. We can receive forgiveness for our sins if we trust in Him.

Naturalism: There is no right and wrong. What we think is right and wrong are just feelings and governments get to make up the rules.

New spirituality: Right and wrong are feelings and each person decides what is right and wrong for him- or herself.

Islam: Right and wrong are Truths that Allah has decided. Humans learn right and wrong from reading the Quran and learning about the life of Mohammed.

Postmodernism: Right and wrong are feelings and communities decide the rules.

Read through what the Bible teaches about right and wrong again. (Leviticus 11:45, Romans 3:23, Isaiah 59:2, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Romans 10:9.) Spend time thanking God for sending Jesus. Pray for those who practice other worldviews and ask that God would provide you with opportunities to share the good news of Jesus with them.
