Questions

- How does David's response to Nathan's confrontation challenge us in how we handle being called out for our own wrongdoing?
- What does it mean that David says 'Against you, you only, have I sinned' when he clearly hurt Bathsheba and Uriah as well?
- The pastor mentioned that unconfessed sin 'eats away at you slowly.' Have you experienced this weight of unconfessed sin in your own life?
- David asks God to 'create in me a clean heart.' What areas of your heart need God's cleansing and renewal?
- How does understanding that we're born with a sinful nature (Psalm 51:5) change how we view ourselves and others?
- David promises to 'teach wrongdoers your ways' after experiencing God's forgiveness. How should experiencing God's mercy motivate us to share with others?
- What's the difference between going through religious motions versus having a 'broken and contrite heart' before God?

- The pastor shared about keeping certain 'rooms' of our lives locked away from God. What rooms in your life might you be keeping from God's access?

Life Application

This week, spend time in honest reflection and prayer, asking God to reveal any areas of unconfessed sin in your life. Consider keeping a prayer journal where you can bring these things to God in confession, experiencing the freedom and renewal that comes through His forgiveness. If you're not yet a believer, consider taking the step to enter into a relationship with Jesus Christ as your Savior.

- We must recognize our sin and understand that we are born with a sinful nature that separates us from God
- True repentance involves humbly requesting God's mercy based on His character, not our own goodness
- When we experience God's forgiveness, we should respond by sharing His love with others and living with renewed hearts
- Unconfessed sin weighs heavily on our souls and affects our relationship with God and others
- Repentance leads to God's forgiveness, which makes our hearts renewed and brings true freedom
