## **Questions**

- How does remembering what Jesus has already done for us (His death and resurrection) help us in our daily struggles?
- In what ways do you see Jesus as a 'warrior' fighting against evil in your own life and in the world today?
- The Israelites sang their gratitude out loud together. How important is it for us to express our thankfulness to Jesus vocally with others?
- How does understanding Jesus' perfect righteousness and justice give you hope for the future, especially when you see evil and injustice in the world?

- What parallels do you see between Israel's deliverance from Egypt and our deliverance from sin and death through Jesus?
- The song in Exodus 15 moves from past victory to present praise to future hope. How can this pattern shape our own prayers and worship?
- How does focusing on Jesus' future reign and kingdom help you persevere through current difficulties?
- What are some practical ways we can cultivate a heart of gratitude for Jesus throughout the year, not just during Thanksgiving?

# **Life Application**

This week, make it a point to verbally express your gratitude to Jesus each day. Whether through prayer, sharing with family and friends during Thanksgiving, or in conversation with others, practice saying out loud what you're thankful to Jesus for. Consider writing down three specific things Jesus has done for you and share them with someone this week.
