so we stand respectfully in silent lament:

Leader: for the children who died while in custody of residential schools,

died of active abuse,

died of lonely hearts and separation from family.

People: Today we acknowledge we have no appropriate words,

so we stand respectfully in silent respect:

Leader: for the families and communities who mourn,

mourn their children who did not come home from residential schools,

mourn the disruption of family and way of life,

mourn the exploitation and desecration of their traditional lands.

Pause in silence

Leader: In gratitude to God who demonstrated the way of reconciliation with us,

People: we commit to walking together in a new way

acknowledging the true history and place of Indigenous Peoples on this land,

acknowledging the treaty relationships we live within on this land, living with respect, listening and learning as we move forward

on the path of true reconciliation.
