

This isn't ideal, but Grace is now well equipped and prepared to continue in person worship regardless of what restrictions and safety protocol may or may not come down. While these steps back may be in our future, the future of Grace is taking great steps forward. Our call committee has made tremendous strides in the completion of our Ministry Site Profile that they synod and ELCA then use to start matching us with candidates for a new pastor. We have a very specific profile that limits our pool of candidates, so finding the ideal one will definitely take time. It is a process, but the process is set up to work and not just blindly or hastily fill an open position.

I have also been working with the synod to find us an interim pastor to serve us during our search. These are usually retired pastors who sign on to be our pastor while we search for a new permanent one. This gives us consistency at the pulpit, provides us pastoral care, and provides us with guidance as we move forward as a church in the unknown of who our next pastor will be. Hopefully by November we'll have someone in place.

Continue to pray for our leadership, our worship team, our call committee, and all of our Grace family as we continue to take strides forward as a congregation.



July and August are catch-up and reflection months, with some mid-year tasks.



These funds have graciously assisted our payroll finances during this past year indeed! Tricia has sent required documentation to the State of IL for our sales tax exemption to be renewed - present one expires in September. For those that do make purchases on behalf of Grace, this document is quite useful in capturing some funds/not paying sales tax. We will keep you updated.



I was born and raised on the Northwest side of Chicago in the Humboldt Park area during the Depression of the 1930s. Not that I was aware of any money shortages other than it was now my job to cross my fingers, arms, legs and toes every day while my father called the union office to see if there were any job openings that day. He was a union printer and one of the few (at the time) who knew how to do rotogravure (color) printing.

I remember he even printed the color ration books everyone used to get meat, shoes, tires, etc. During World War II, we were only allowed one pair of shoes per person each year. So, we had to patch the shoes up and put cardboard insoles if they got holes. If the sole got unglued, my Dad would glue them back on but they never held together. So, it would flap on

your feet, and you had to find a new way of walking or running. But nobody cared because everyone had the same problem of bad shoes and hand-me-downs.

I met my husband, Ralph, while I was in YPS (youth group) at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Humboldt Park. We married in 1953. It's amazing how many of us married within the youth group -- and stayed married. We continued to be active in the choir and church council. We had 5 children, three girls and two boys.

We have five grandchildren, ranging in age from 44 to a brand-new baby girl, as well as two great-grandchildren, now in their teens. Unfortunately, Ralph didn't get to meet his two great-grandchildren, and the new baby grandchild as he died in 2001.

Both Ralph and I have always been choir members at any church we attended. I started choir when I was 13 after my mother died.

We become members of Grace not long after moving to St. Charles in 1972. When we were searching for a new church, the children, born and raised the city, decided it was fun to drive in the country to go to church.
