

This has been a hard year in so many ways. We have diminished in the chaos of 2020, a year that many hope would bring a refreshing freeing clarity. Instead we have found ourselves held in bondage by a terrible pandemic, lamenting racial unrest and the violence that caused it, watching political rancor and division. This was the year of "I can't breathe" and also the year when we found that we could not breathe. Here we are, almost to the end of this chaotic and confounding year.

We are beginning a new year in the Church, the season of Advent. Advent is the season where we prepare and wait with anticipation for the arrival of Jesus – God's dream to be born. Like so much of 2020, Advent looks different this year, but we are modifying plans and finding new ways to align our hopes with our present realities and lean into God's dreams. Advent is for the dreamers in all of us – those who dream of a deeper connection with God and those who dream of a better world. Advent is for those who dream of comfort and also for those who have given up on their dreams. Advent is for those whose dreams have been crushed and for those who wisely teach us that dreams take soul time.



We've chosen the theme of **Those Who Dream*** for Advent. It is shaped by the words from Psalm 126, which opens with the line, "**When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream**." This theme is for the dreamers in all of us—those who dream of a deeper connection with God and those who dream of a better world. It is for those who dream of comfort and for those who have given up on their dreams. It is for those whose dreams have been crushed and for those who know dreams take time.

The scriptures and stories we will share throughout Advent will help us imagine what it looks like to live as those who dream, especially during difficult times. We will be guided by the prophets, the psalmists, John the Baptist, Mary, Elizabeth, Joseph, Simeon, Anna, the shepherds, and the Magi. We can learn from these dreamers who came before us, who received and responded to God's dream for the world.

The **Those Who Dream** series will begin Sunday, November 29, and officially conclude on Epiphany, January 3. (But we hope that you will continue dreaming, growing with God and fulfilling God's dream in your every waking moment.) Everything we do as a faith community during these weeks will center around this theme. We are providing Advent Take-Home Bags with a booklet, **Words for Those Who Dream**, filled with reflections and even creative art projects for this season of dreaming, and an Advent tactile meditation for each week. There will also be Star words for our Epiphany journey. And our Christmas Giving opportunities dedicated to the promise helping others near and far. Within the season we have tried to dream up some different things for us to experience both comfort and vigilance this



year: a new service, **The Longest Night** (December 21) will help us face the unrealized dreams and losses of this challenging year and **Outdoor: Driver its Style** (**This times as year filled and the line of the longing year and longing yea**

November 29th - First Sunday in Advent Sermon Title: Keep Awake (hope)

Theme: Those who dream do not fall asleep to the realities of the world. God prompts us to pay attention to where God's dreams for change and new life are emerging. In Advent, we remember that God's ultimate dream is to be intimately connected to us—to come down and dwell among us. As we keep awake, we join Isaiah and the psalmist in pleading for restoration and for God to draw near

December 6th – 2nd Sunday in Advent Sermon Title: "Prepare the way" (peace)

Theme: John the Baptist calls the crowds into the journey of repentance and transformation. Similarly, we are called to prepare the way for God's message of love and liberation to be shouted, heard, and received. Those who dream make way for righteousness and peace to kiss, for faithfulness to spring up from the ground (Ps. 85:10-11).

December 13th - 3rd Sunday in Advent Sermon Title: "Sow joy (joy)"

Theme: Ultimately, dreams sow joy, even if that joy doesn't immediately spring forth. Sowing seeds into the soil always feels risky and feeble—how can something so small become something so beautiful, so big, and so nourishing? Like Mary, we are called to tend and nurture the dreams God has woven into us.

December 20th – 4th Sunday in Advent Sermon Title: "You are Not Alone; Help to Carry Dreams (love)"

Theme: This week, we recognize what preceded Mary's song of praise: news that was disorienting and bewildering, possibly threatening her life. Together, Mary and Elizabeth find courage and comfort in spite of their unusual circumstances. We, too, are called to carry, support, and encourage one another's dreams.

December 21st - A LONGEST NIGHT SERVICE for a Service of Remembrance & Lament

An Advent tradition within Western Christianity to come together for the Longest Night, a night around the time of the winter solstice, when there are more hours of darkness than light. A time to come together for prayers and laments, to mourn the losses and griefs of the year, to let the tears flow for the hurting places in our own lives, as well as for our country and our world. Known also as "Blue Christmas," a Longest Night Gathering is a safe and sacred space to share anguish, to plead with God to remember us, to pray for justice and restoration, even to hope against hope, through our doubts and tears and fears, that "God will set things right all over the earth." 2

December 24th - CHRISTMAS EVE "WE DREAM TOGETHER"


Overall themes: The Christmas story reminds us that we are all dreamers. Like those gathered around the manger, we come to this night each year with awe, wonder, and holy imagination for what is possible. Like Mary, we treasure God's dream in our hearts and commit to keeping it alive and growing.

December 27th - 1st Sunday after Christmas Sermon Title: ""Those who Dream... will not Keep Silent"

Overall themes: God's dreams are not for us alone. Simeon and Anna could not keep silent—they witnessed Jesus' divine presence in the temple and were compelled to speak up. Like the prophet Isaiah, we will not keep silent and we will not rest until what has been sown will spring up as righteousness and peace in every nation (Is. 61:11-62:2).



Six months into the Covid and we are still learning many things. One thing we know for sure regardless is that we have to revamp our Christian Education processes for now and for in the future. We want to structure a supportive and engaging for all ages. It is a challenge to do that during the times we are face-to-face, now an even greater experiment. Grace Lutheran Church of Lily Lake is proud to introduce to you:

FAITH 5

FAITH 5, developed by Dr. Rich Melheim, a Lutheran pastor and the founder of Faith Inkubators, is a five-step ritual that's being applauded across the U.S. for instilling a sense of security and optimism. It is a 20-30 minute soaking in God's word and care for members of your family and friends. We are going to ask families to share in it together nightly; and we are going to partner up willing singles and pairs to have some study buddies so that we can nurture our faith and create a caring, close-knit faith family that even the Waltons might envy.

FAITH 5 connects church to home, faith to life, and friends/family members to one another in a powerful way. In essence Faith5 does is an easy-to-follow formula that covers some important basics and empowers even the least confident discussion leader. It doesn't hurt that Faith5 loads in a huge fun factor as well. So who is in?

The **FAITH 5** steps are:

- Step One: Share highs and lows. Name something good and bad you experienced today.
 Can't think of a personal one? Check out the headlines from the news and teach empathy and compassion for the broader world.
- Step Two: Read a verse/story from your Bible. This could be something you choose as a family/group or one of the weekly lessons from our service or picked popcorn style at random from the Bible.
- Step Three: Talk about how the verse relates to highs and lows. Unpack the verse a bit. What does it mean in your own words? How might it relate to where you are today in your highs and lows?
- Step Four: Pray for one another's highs and lows, for your family, and for the world. Simply
 talk to God, thank Jesus for the good, and ask the Holy Spirit for guidance in specific
 problems.
- Step Five: Bless one another. Trace the sign of the cross on one another's forehead or palm as a reminder that you belong to God and to one another.

At Grace, we will engage in Faith 5 until at least the end of 2020 as we plan and structure our regular split levels Christian Education programs (i.e. Sunday School, Confirmation, Bible Studies, VBS, etc.). We will be holding an ALL Grace FAITH 5 monthly at our second Sunday Zoom Fellowship. Confirmation students and their families are expected to engage in FAITH 5 as a family and on monthly Zoom, as well as participate in regular Zoom classes. (Times/Dates TBA)
