

If not for the hard work and generosity of all of you, the last two years could have been about closing Grace and not dealing with the challenges of being Grace in a pandemic. Again, this is a true testament to the people of Grace.

Up until COVID, we were also getting in the habit of having events at Grace almost every month, serving our community more, and reaching out to our community. All things that can and should continue once we are able.

I just want to on a prayer of thank you to all of you for your support over the last five years.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Most of January has been focused on the annual meeting planning. I pray that you have taken the time to review the Annual Report that gives you a recap of the 2021 year at Grace – by absorbing the team's reports, it should spark questions & introspect as to how you can become involved. We all need to convey our sincere thanks to Cathy Whiteside who graciously has taken on this task of assembling this report in the past several years (she appreciated receiving the submitted reports in a timely manner – thank you all!).

Just a couple of reminders in the next month:

- ~ if you receive offering envelopes, please take note of the "Initial Offering" envelope included to help offset the cost of these envelopes. The cost is approx. \$9 per person, each year. Please consider making an extra donation towards this cost & thank you for your giving support.
- ~ THRIVENT members please review your accounts and consider designating your CHOICE DOLLARS to Grace of Lily Lake. In 2021, Grace received \$1,205 from your CHOICE DOLLARS let's see if we can reach our proposed budget amount of \$1,500 in 2022.
- ~ Yes, it has been chilly in our sanctuary! At our Congregational Meeting on Dec. 19, members approved the heating addition to our current HVAC system for the sanctuary (cost \$11,650) we anticipate this installation in Feb 2022. If you would like to make a contribution towards the "Keep the Church Warm" (fund of sorts), please indicate this on your contribution check. This will go into our General Fund and to date, we have received \$650 earmarked for this tally.



Getting to Know You



Greetings to my family at Grace.

It seems as if I have been a member of Grace forever, and actually, I have been here for quite a while – since 1975. It will soon be 50 years!

My husband Kirk and I both grew up in NJ, in small, country towns. We met during high school and married after college. I started my nursing career and Kirk, his, as a designer/draftsman for Bell Telephone Labs. We stayed in NJ (in bigger towns though) to begin our family. Tracy born in 1963. Earl Michael in 1964 and Katie in 1968. Then in 1972 we were offered an opportunity to move to ND with Bell on a government job and stayed there for 3 years. Oh, how we loved the ND life. 
