#### **HOLY COMMUNION**

Communion will be celebrated on **January 4**. If you are willing to serve, please sign up on the church website. For those worshipping online, please have your communion elements ready.

#### **EPIPHANY STAR WORDS**

On Sunday, **January 4**, we begin the season of Epiphany, remembering the star that led the wise ones to Jesus. God's presence is breaking through to shine as a light in the darkness! This can bring comfort to those weary from grief and the stress of the holidays.

First United Methodist Church will be offering Epiphany STAR WORDS to any who would like to begin the new year with an intentional focus. Over 300 different words are printed on gold stars, words such as affirmation, blessing, encouragement, obedience, service, etc. Those in worship will pick a star word from a basket. Those online are encouraged to reach out to the church office to have a star word mailed to them (262.542.4256, [office@fumcwaukesha.org](mailto:office@fumcwaukesha.org)).

*When receiving a star gift:*

- Let the word pick YOU. This is your word of the year. Ponder what significance this word has in your life and how God might be speaking to you through the power of one word. (If requesting a star word through the mail, the office staff will randomly draw a star for you.)
- You may find that the word fits you perfectly. If so, celebrate that, and see how you can be more intentional about sharing your star gift with the world.
- You may find it is a word that offers you the encouragement or challenge you need. If so, receive that gift and let it shape you in the days, weeks, and months ahead.
- If unsure as to the meaning of the word, look it up. You might even search for synonymous words, to help you discover even more about your potential focus. Refrain from getting stuck with one definition. Allow it to broaden your understanding.
- You may find yourself resisting the word or even wanting to reject the word. If so, sit with it for a while, exploring the source of your resistance, and be open to what this word may have to teach you.
- Live with your word, reflect upon it, journal about it, pray about it. Place it in a location where you will see it every day: bathroom mirror, car visor, in the pages of your Bible, tacked above your computer or kitchen sink.

The wise one traveled a great distance to offer their gifts to the Christ-child when responding to the gift first given to them. They received God's gift, then offered their gifts to God. This will be our Epiphany practice: receiving God's gift and then offering the gift in service to God throughout the year.

Like any gift, a star gift can either be received with joy or discarded and forgotten. You are encouraged to be intentional about your response to your star word.

Epiphany is the celebration of God's presence breaking through to shine as a light in the darkness. Let us rejoice in the presence of our generous, giving God, one star gift at a time.

## **FAIR TRADE COFFEE, CHOCOLATE & OLIVE OIL**

Church and Society will sell Fair Trade and organic coffee, chocolate, and extra virgin olive oil, on Sunday, **January 11** after worship in the Asbury Room. Please stop by to check out our inventory. We accept cash or checks made out to FUMC with "Fair Trade" in the memo line.

**Dear Fair Trade Supporters:** *Equal Exchange, FUMC's chocolate bar, coffee, and olive oil supplier, was forced to raise their prices due to increased cost of production as well as geopolitical factors. Unfortunately, we must pass some of the cost increase along to our loyal patrons. Therefore, starting in **February** of 2026, the price for all roasts and types of coffee will be \$10 per bag. This is an increase of \$1 per bag, except for decaffeinated, which remains at \$10. Also, single quantity chocolate bars will continue to be priced at \$4, but the price of two purchased bars increases to \$7 per pair, which is still a deal. While these changes do challenge us, we believe the products are fairly priced, especially in comparison to other outlets where Fair Trade products are sold. We hope that you will continue to support our mission to build economically just and environmentally sound trade partnerships with small-scale farmers, fostering fair, democratic, and sustainable relationships between producers and consumers by championing Fair Trade principles, worker cooperatives, and organic practices for a more equitable world.*

Did you know that First United Methodist Church has a Memorial Foundation, overseen by a volunteer committee? The Memorial Foundation was established in 1971 to support the mission and ministry of FUMC. It takes in memorial gifts, bequests, and estate gifts and then conservatively invests the funds until the church has a need that can't be met through other means. This year, 2026, is the 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Memorial Foundation (our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary occurred during covid) and to celebrate this, the committee will present a Foundation-Fact-of-the-Month for each month of 2026. ### **HEALING HEARTS GRANT AWARD!**

Healing Hearts, a building partner of FUMC, recently applied for a grant through Potawatomi Casino Heart on Canel Street. This grant is only available to nonprofits that primarily serve children. After an application process, nonprofit organizations are selected to be invited to the event, but no winners are announced until the event "lottery drawing". Potawatomi selects 30 winning nonprofits and each is awarded \$24,000.00. Healing Hearts was one of the winners this year! We are truly grateful for this gift.

Potawatomi also raised \$722,380.00 from this event. The money is raised from the community playing Heart on Canal Street Bingo. This year, the Potawatomi celebrated its 30th anniversary awarding these grants. As a community, we are truly blessed to have companies in the area that give back to those in need.
