Take the time to stream your favorite Christmas hymns, carols, and songs. It can be easy to get caught up in all the busyness and miss Jesus. He is the point of all the extra things we do to begin with.

We have two exciting, unique ways you can stay focused upon God this Advent season. The first way is to pick up the devotional called "Unwrapping the Names of Jesus" by Asheritah Ciuciu. Each day of December there is a different name of Jesus and about ten minutes of reading. This devotional can bring new insight and focus to your entire season.



Each Sunday during Advent, I will be preaching on a different name of Jesus as well. This devotional will tie into the theme of "Advent at Bethany Church" while also bringing deeper context to many of the different names of Jesus in Scripture. No single name could possibly explain all the different aspects of God. When we study these names, we get a clearer picture of who Jesus is.

Starting Sunday, December 3, the first Sunday of Advent, we will also have ornaments available with the different names of Jesus on them. These ornaments will correspond with the names being taught about each week. It is our prayer that you will use these ornaments as a second way to uniquely focus upon God. They are created by the ladies of Bethany as a project to bless everyone. Much like the Advent wreath, I suggest you look over the various names and place each ornament on your tree on the Sunday with which it corresponds. Week one is "Messiah". Week two is "Bread of Life". Week three is "The Resurrection and Life". Week four is "Prince of Peace". Christmas Eve is "Immanuel". As you go about life in your home and around your tree, use these ornaments as reminders to engage with God, to put Him first, to breathe new life into what you already know about God and what you are learning for the first time. Let us keep Christ central together this Advent season.

# What I Have Learned Through a Devastating Time

December is a very hard month for me. As some of you may know, my only son Ryan passed away at the age of 44 on December 26, 2020. He lived in Texas, and we didn't know he was so seriously ill. I talked to him every day. He didn't want to worry me. Toward the end, he was saying a few things that made me concerned. However, he assured me that it was nothing and that if he felt worse, he would get help. He lived alone.

We talked twice on Christmas Day. On the morning of the 26th, we texted. He said he was going to go to Urgent Care. He promised. So, I called in an hour...two hours...all afternoon. I then called the police to go check on him. They would not go in his house. I said, "I know he is in there." They wouldn't go in until the morning of the 27th. I received a call - while driving- telling me my son was deceased. I wailed alone in my car. We later learned it was liver failure.

That call changed my life forever. I can't even describe my feelings. So painful. I questioned God. Why? I dedicated my son back to You to keep and watch over. I prayed for him every single day. Didn't You hear me? Why?

Why? Was I not good enough? Do You not love me God? I trusted You!

It took me awhile, but with lots of prayer, searching the Scriptures, conversations with God and great talks with strong Christian people, I came to an understanding...


I understand that I am not in charge. His ways are higher than my ways. He knows the future. He called my son Home. It was his time. We all have a time. He knows our time before we even begin our life. Nothing I could have done would have changed what happened.

I have peace now. I know I will be with my son again. He loved Jesus as his Savior. He loved and studied the Bible. He even told me a week before his death "to live is Christ and to die is gain." This brings me much comfort.

I learned... Joy and Sorrow can coexist.

So, what is the most important message to pass on from all of this? It is to make sure your children and grandchildren accept Jesus as their Savior now! We are not guaranteed another hour or another day. My hope is in the Lord. Ryan is in Heaven, and I'm sure he's making Jesus laugh. What a great kid he is! I talk to Jesus everyday and ask Him to tell Ryan I said hi and that I love him. I will meet Jesus and Ryan in the Rapture. See you soon. I love you. Please, make sure your family will be with you in Heaven, too. Love you all.


