Bethany Family,

January has arrived, and with it comes the familiar conversations: dieting, change, goal-setting, and looking ahead to what a new year might bring. Some of us are energized by those plans, and others of us are already tired of the entire discussion.

This year, I'd like to invite us to walk a different road together. Recently, my family visited the Ligo Farm. We watched the cows, young and old, simply being cows. It was bitterly cold, and Christmas was fast approaching. Toward the end of our visit, Amy reminded me of something deeply important... the discipline of celebration. Taking time to celebrate what is good and beautiful in our lives, how God has blessed us and cared for us, and why this life matters. Celebration orients our hearts toward God and cultivates gratitude (1 Thessalonians 5:18; Psalm 100:4–5). God is tirelessly at work for our good (Romans 8:28), and He promises to continue caring for us and providing for our needs (Matthew 6:34).

We can celebrate both individually and as a community of believers. It's this shared celebration that I especially want to draw your attention to. Bethany has much to celebrate from 2025. Each of us likely has a favorite memory or two... perhaps a personal moment, a meaningful connection, a time when the Holy Spirit opened your eyes, or a moment when you felt carried through a difficult season.

As I remember this year, here are some moments I want to celebrate: Easter was a significant celebration and a turning point for our church. We embraced revival and witnessed God moving among us in fresh ways. We sensed clearly that God was doing a "new thing" in our midst.

We also made many new friends this year. Through the faithful ministry of The Haven food pantry, Big Summer Playdates, and our large Block Party, God continued to bring people into our community. We were also blessed to welcome new members through classes in both the Spring and the Fall. God is moving, can you see it? Can you feel it? Perhaps there is

Because of your generosity, this year has been full of moments where young people were seen, known, and loved:

- 89 kids experienced Young Life Summer Camp—where many students heard the gospel for the first time!
- 67 volunteer leaders were trained and equipped to walk with teens through life's highs and lows.
- We welcomed Jocelyn Roth to our staff team, expanding our outreach at Slippery Rock University.
- Through many countless conversations, car rides, and shared laughter, kids heard the good news: they are deeply loved by Jesus!

This true story of two 7th grade girls in our community shows this so well. Sarah and Maria showed up at their first WyldLife Club, with no desire to hear about Jesus. (not their real names) Not only were they not interested, they made fun of the idea of church and Jesus the whole time. Disinterested and bored, they told their leader they didn't want to come to Club again.

Empowered by the Holy Spirit and the account of Jesus going after the lost sheep... their leader showed up at the middle school that week with the goal of finding Sarah and Maria. After finding them and talking a little about life, she convinced them to give WyldLife Club one more shot.

That night, they showed up! But once again started to joke about the idea of Jesus. Jessie asked if they understood the seriousness of what they were joking about, and began to tell them about who Jesus actually was, and the girls started to lean in. Jessie asked if they knew what the gospel was and they looked at her confused, so she got to share the gospel with them. After sharing, Maria burst into tears and said, "No one has ever talked to me about God like that before!"

Just minutes after this conversation, Jessie got up in front of the whole room of middle school students and shared about what it was like to commit to a relationship with Jesus. After the talk Jessie found Maria and Sarah and they both burst into tears, opening up about their struggle with depression and self harm.

Jessie was able to listen to them and share God's love with them,

and they were both eager to accept Jesus into their life! They did so and immediately felt lighter and visibly brighter!

When Sarah got home she texted Jessie that she threw away all the harmful substances she had, and she asked if she could share about her story at Club the next week. Here is an excerpt of what Sarah said:

"I prayed a prayer that changed my life and gave my life to Jesus all because of my leader, Jessie.

I will never forget how she made me feel seen, loved, and cared about. At first, it felt weird because I never thought anyone saw me how she did; she showed me that I'm important and not only important, that I mattered."

This is why our team continues to go: that more and more kids would know the hope and value that is found in Jesus alone.


We are also able to maintain the needed food supply for the growing number of students using the Mercer High School Food Pantry. Back packs were filled full of food for students to take home over holiday break.

WINTER GIVES US A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO REST, REFLECT, AND DRAW CLOSE TO CHRIST. IN THE SLOWER PACE, WE FIND ROOM TO LISTEN FOR GOD'S VOICE. 

Bethany Financial Statement


Through November 2025
