


Church Family,

You may be asking, why is the Pastor doing a long series on the book of 1 Kings? Why give us all this information about these Kings of Israel and Judah? For many pastors the Old Testament can be hard to preach. Pastors tend to stick with the New Testament. I decided early on in my study and ministry that I wanted to make sure that I really understood the Old Testament. This was very intentional for me because I recognize that over 2/3 of the Bible is the Old Testament. As Christians and specifically as a Pastor, it seemed wrong to know so little and spend so little time learning and reading the Old Testament. Therefore, as I decide what to preach and when, I always consider the Old Testament. I try to have a rotation in my preaching that moves from the Old Testament to the Gospels in the New Testament to the Letters/Epistles in the New Testament. In this way, I make sure I am regularly learning from all areas of the Bible, and I encourage Bethany to do the same.

This desire to both know and regularly interact with the Old Testament comes from a high view of Scripture. All of the Bible is the Word of God. All of it is perfect and inerrant. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 applies to all Scripture: "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." Therefore, we should regularly read, study, and understand the Old Testament. Yet, I find that many believers do not have a good working concept of what happened in the years of the kings in Scripture. There are so many kings, all the names are foreign, and there are Israel and Judah to remember. The culture, politics, and economics are all radically different. This is all true, yet it is still the Word of God. There is still purpose in understanding this section of the Bible and an application we can understand for our lives.

The Old Testament is the foundation for which the New Testament rests. Without the Old Testament, the New Testament would not make sense. Just speaking of Jesus dying on the cross and rising again three days later will highlight my point. Without the Old Testament sacrificial system and example of the shedding of blood as remission of sins, there would not be a foundation to understand how Jesus dving on the cross could grant us forgiveness before God (Hebrews 9:22). Without the perfect lamb sacrifice found in the Old Testament, we would not understand the words of John the Baptist. "The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). Jesus is the perfect lamb sacrifice that was foreshadowed to Israel. There are almost 300 direct quotes found in the New Testament from the Old Testament and that is without considering summaries and paraphrased sections. The Apostles and Jesus saw immense value in the Old Testament.

I encourage everyone to consider taking a closer look at the Old Testament. Take the time to study it, understand the context and culture, and see how your faith and understanding in God comes alive. There is a mountain of depth to be found as we study. Studying the Old Testament will help us fully understand who God is, what God is about, and what God freely promised us as sons and daughters in the kingdom.

Women's Bible Study

Over 30 women from Bethany and the Mercer community are studying "The Armor of God" video series by Priscilla Shirer. The study uses Ephesians 6 to challenge women to have an action plan for putting on their armor and developing a personalized strategy to secure victory against the enemy. They are learning to suit up, stand firm, and secure victory in their lives!



Outreach Team Update



God's VISION for Bethany Church:

<u>SERVE</u> our community => <u>SHARE</u> the gospel => <u>MAKE</u> disciples

By now you may have heard the amazing news! With Session's approval, the Outreach Team applied to become an agency member of the Mercer County Food Bank. On January 18, 2024, Bethany was approved as Mercer's first brick and mortar food pantry since Loaves and Fishes moved their pantry to Coolspring Township years ago, and then closed two years ago.

While plans and procedures are being developed by the Outreach Team in preparation for opening day, our faithful and talented Property Committee will be upgrading and preparing the 3-bay garage to store food products in two of the three bays.

The following is a List of Townships/Borough in the Mercer School District that will be eligible for The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) at Bethany Church:

- Coolspring Township
- East Lackawannock Township
- · Findley Township
- Jefferson Township
- · Mercer Borough

The Bethany Food Pantry plans to open on June 22, and will begin serving all eligible TEFAP individuals and families on the fourth Saturday of each month from 1-3pm.

At every Outreach Team meeting we pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance to discern the answer to one very important question: How does God want to reveal and express Himself through Bethany Church in the Mercer community at this time?

What we know:

All three aspects of Bethany's Vision Statement will be met through our endeavor to provide a Mercer community food pantry.

- SERVE our community: Revealing and expressing the love of Christ to our economically challenged neighbors by meeting needs for food, and other relevant workshops and services the Outreach Team plans to offer for helping individuals and families find ways to help themselves move from where they currently are to where they would like to be physically, financially, and spiritually.
- SHARE the Gospel: It is God's mandate and Bethany's primary purpose for existing. We have the freedom to hang posters, hand out flyers, to share the love and good news of Jesus to all who come, to pray with them, invite them to our worship services, and encourage them to take part in our ministries and church events.
- MAKE Disciples: Bethany endeavors to be faithful to Christ's Great Commission. It is our hope and prayers that many will eventually come to our events with the primary hope that some will come to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior and be discipled at Bethany.

Scripture tells us "The poor you will always have with you..." (Matt 26:11). However, Scripture does not tell us the poor we serve all have to be the same faces month after month. If our services and efforts can move some people to a place where they are no longer dependent on government handouts, where they have clearly heard the gospel message, and God willing, where some have received Christ as their personal Lord and Savior, and have become regular attenders being discipled at Bethany, then we will be successfully living out God's vision for Bethany Church utilizing the food pantry as an entry point to potential opportunities for life transformation. Finally, there will be many volunteer opportunities once the food pantry opens. If the Holy Spirit is burdening your heart and giving you a passion to serve families who are currently experiencing food insecurity, as well as other life challenges, please call the church office, provide your contact information, and someone will be in touch with you to provide more information on how and where your gifts and talents can best be utilized in this worthy and exciting adventure God has placed before us.


