Bethany Family,

Bethany Church is thrilled to announce the beginning of our Community Center Project... a space designed to help us connect, grow, and serve together as a church family and with our Mercer community.

Perhaps you heard about the project during our worship service on Sunday, October 19, or maybe this is your first time hearing about it. Either way, I wanted to make sure we shared all the details with you.

Why Create a Community Center?

For years, we've noticed how crowded our lobby and hallways can be on Sunday mornings. While our church family is warm and welcoming, the limited space makes it difficult to linger, talk, and build relationships.

The new 1,400-square-foot Community Center will transform our current office area into a bright, open, and versatile space located right next to the elevator.

This new space will foster fellowship and deeper connection among those who attend Bethany, while also serving as a welcoming environment for visitors and community events. It will offer a comfortable setting for discipleship groups, prayer, and ministry activities. Ministries like The Haven, Scouts, Mom's Group, and many others will also benefit from this space. In all these ways, this project aligns perfectly with our mission: to serve our community, share the Gospel, and make disciples.

Planning and Construction

A dedicated committee comprised of church members, staff, three elders, and four property committee members has spent months planning this space. After touring other churches and exploring various options, a final plan was approved by Session.

Here's what you can expect:

Rooms 101–104 will be removed, and the hallway will be incorporated to create an open area. Offices will be relocated to nearby rooms, including the Anderson Room, Library, and Children's Office. (continued on p. 2)

Most of the work will be contracted out, but we'll also rely on church volunteers for painting, demolition, and light construction.








"A Thankful Heart in a Busy Season"




