Bethany Church,

As we look to Fall, the kids are on their way back to school, the leaves turn, the weather cools, and the holiday season is right around the corner. With each season change, there is a natural rhythm where we consider our priorities and try to set new goals. For example, I would like to double down on teaching my eldest son Robbie how to play the piano. We have tried to teach him a few times, but I find myself too busy to prioritize it. Perhaps you have a goal or two you would like to accomplish this Fall.

We recently announced our Fall Discipleship Groups. There are five different groups that all begin in September and run through November or early December. Each one runs at a different time and tries to meet different needs that people might have. Some have childcare while others do not. Additionally, each one studies a different Biblical topic. There are Old Testament studies, Gospel studies, and even a study on the Holy Land itself.

Each group strives to accomplish three goals. First, they want to study Scripture and provide an opportunity for people to learn about God through Scripture study. We recognize that Scriptures guide us into a deeper and stronger relationship with God. "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16-17)


Second, each group strives to provide a safe atmosphere where people can ask guestions and learn from each other. Part of the (continued from page 1)

power of Discipleship Groups is that they encourage questions and learning in a context that is unique and very different from worship on Sunday morning. "Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another." (Proverbs 27:17) When we come together and talk about God, we sharpen each other in our pursuit to become more like Jesus.

Finally, these groups foster fellowship, which is a fancy word to describe a group of people who love Jesus and share each other's burdens. They pray with each other, care for each other, and serve each other. "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working." (James 5:16) When we fellowship together we are stronger and able to endure hardship in this life together.

Would you consider prioritizing a Discipleship Group this Fall? Pick one to faithfully attend remembering that your Christian faith is not meant to be walked alone. Remember what God says in Galatians: "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life." (Galatians 6:7-8) When we choose to invest in the things of God, He will bless our lives and grant us spiritual maturity as we continue to grow and learn about Him. We will gain wisdom and knowledge and have the tools to make the right decisions at the right time. It is a simple question and a challenge before you. Will you prioritize your spiritual walk and join a Discipleship Group this Fall?

My teacher told me my dyslexia would mean I'd never be any good at poetry, but I've made a jug and a couple of vases so far and I think they look great.


I didn't know my girlfriend had left me for a tractor salesman until I read the John Deere letter.

THE BRIDGE FORWARD





As we prepare for the 2025-2026 school year, beginning on September 8, we have some immediate needs where your support can truly be the difference. Would you take a moment to read through the opportunities below and prayerfully consider how your church can respond? **School Supplies for Students**

Every August, EduNations purchases school supplies for thousands of students across our schools. While many are covered through student sponsorships, over 3,000 students remain unsponsored, leaving a significant gap of \$31,500 for school supplies. We've received a \$5,000 grant, and \$8,500 in sponsorship funds will cover a portion—but we still have a significant need to meet our \$45,000 budget to ensure every child has what they need on day one.
