Grace Upon Grace





The Season of Epiphany begins on January 6!

The visit of the magi/stargazers/wisemen from the East to worship and revere the infant Jesus, the newborn king inaugurates this season of continuing to answer the questions of who Jesus is and what does it mean?

When thinking of these sages from long ago trekking across the desert to see Jesus leads one to consider how we practice the reverence of God in this 21st Century. Paul Woodruff writes: "Reverence is the virtue that keeps people from trying to act like gods. Reverence is the recognition of something greater than the self-something that is beyond human creation or control, that transcends full human understanding. Reverence stands in awe of something, something that dwarfs the self, that allows human beings to sense the full extent of our limits, so that we can begin to see one another more reverently."



A recent Wall Street Journal article shared about a family-owned company in Alabama which made a radical decision when the Eaton Corporation made an offer to buy the company for \$1.7 billion. The CEO of the family business agreed on one condition, 15% of the offer (\$255 million) would be distributed to the employees in the form of bonuses to be paid over a fiveyear period. Though this company paid their workers a livable wage, the CEO wanted to affirm the value these workers offered in growing the company and staying with the company during difficult times. When the employees were called to meet with the CEO and another staff member, they were handed an envelope which most assumed contained a termination of employment notice due to the sale of the company. When they opened the envelope and saw a check in their name and the amount attached, they were overwhelmed with shock, disbelief, and amazement. These employees received life-changing checks which allowed them to imagine a future. All would still have their positions if they wanted to continue. Most paid off debt, invested in educating themselves or family members, secured reliable transportation, or took a long-postponed vacation. Some realized they could retire. Living generously, loving boldly changes lives for the good and reflects a God who has always been generous and loving.

1-Endowment Committee Member

The Endowment Committee has responsibility of oversight for and grant recommendations from our Love of Christ Endowment Fund. Over the past several years our Endowment Fund has grown to over \$127,000 and the Committee anticipates making initial grants in 2026. Fund by-laws dictate how the funds are to be disbursed, but the primary recipients are in support of mission opportunities within the ELCA and Grand Canyon Synod. The Committee tries to meet quarterly on the 2nd Tuesday of the month prior to a LoC Board Meeting. There is a need for one Endowment Committee nominee to serve a two-year term beginning 3/1/26. We are always looking for members of the Nominating Committee, who help identify and nominate members to serve on the LoC Board, Endowment Fund Committee and Audit Committee. 

Handbell Ringers Needed


Do you read music and count beats? We would love to have you join our Handbell Choir! We are looking for ringers for monthly Sunday performances.

The LoC Book Club will meet on Sunday, January 11, to discuss the book below:





Jeremiah 31:7-14

For thus says the Lord:

Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, "Save, O Lord, your people, the remnant of Israel." See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labor together; a great company, they shall return here. With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back; I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path where they shall not stumble, for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn.

Hear the word of the Lord, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; say, "He who scattered Israel will gather him and will keep him as a shepherd does a flock." For the Lord has ransomed Jacob and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him. They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion, and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the Lord, over the grain, the wine, and the oil, and over the young of the flock and the herd; their life shall become like a watered garden, and they shall never languish again. Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry. I will turn their mourning into joy; I will comfort them and give them gladness for sorrow. I will give the priests their fill of fatness, and my people shall be satisfied with my bounty,

Ephesians 1:3-14

says the Lord.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us.

With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inher-

itance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it.

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is the only Son, himself God, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.
