"The Marks of the Messiah"

Through Advent we listen to readings inviting us to be ready, be prepared, be watchful, be faithful, be patient, and to constantly look for the coming Messiah. John the Baptist is in prison for his continued outspokenness regarding the unsavory marriage between King Herod and his brother's wife. After Jesus' baptism he became concerned that his expectation of the coming judgment of God and the deliverance of God's faithful people would soon follow. But Jesus seems to not be meeting John's expectations, so John sends some of his disciples to investigate. Jesus tells his investigators to report his mission is not to bring down the wrath of God, but to reveal God is in the business of reconciliation and restoration. He sends them back with the words of Isaiah which declare the marks of the Messiah, God's Anointed One: the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are healed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and good news is preached to the poor.



The origin of Advent as a season of fasting to prepare for baptisms at Epiphany is particularly evident on the third Sunday. Whenever God comes—in the past in the history of Israel and the incarnation of Jesus, in the present in the word and sacrament of each Sunday, and in the future at the end of all things—a reorienting of our life is called for. The lectionary's readings stand in stark contrast to our society's partying and shopping for Christmas. The coming of Christ means to transform the world, saving all who are in need. The gospel of Advent 3 responds to the gospel of Advent 2: last week John the Baptist predicted the coming judgment, and this week Jesus, also citing the prophet Isaiah, speaks of the transformative power of his ministry. Each week we hear more about what the presence of God means for the world, today and at the end of time. That coming begins here, in word and sacrament.

2-Board Members

The LoC Board of Directors has the responsibility for governance and oversight of the staff and mission of Love of Christ. Board members are elected for a three-year term. The Board meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 6PM excluding July and December. Board members are committed to regular worship and prayer, continued faith-formation, and growing in service and generosity. There will be a need beginning March 1 for two new Board members.


The Endowment Committee has responsibility of oversight for and grant recommendations from our Love of Christ Endowment Fund. Over the past several years our Endowment Fund has grown to over \$127,000.00 and the Committee anticipates making initial grants in 2026. Fund by-laws dictate how the funds are to be disbursed, but the primary recipients are in support of mission opportunities within the ELCA and Grand Canyon Synod. The Committee tries to meet quarterly on the 2nd Tuesday of the month prior to a LoC Board Meeting. There is a need for one Endowment Committee nominee to serve a two-year term beginning 3/1/26. We are always looking for members of the Nominating Committee, who help identify and nominate members to serve on the LoC Board, Endowment Fund Committee and Audit Committee. 

2. Handbell Ringers Needed


Do you read music and count beats? We would love to have you join our Handbell Choir! We are looking for ringers for both monthly Sunday performances and the Christmas Cantata.

The LoC Book Club will meet on Sunday, January 11, to discuss the book below:



In 1872, sixteen-year-old Goes First, a Crow Native woman, marries Abe Farwell, a white fur trader. He gives her the name Mary, and they set off on the long trip to his trading post in Saskatchewan, Canada. Along the way, she finds a fast friend in a Métis named Jeannie; makes a lifelong enemy in a wolfer named Stiller; and despite learning a dark secret of Farwell's past, falls in love with her husband.

The winter trading season passes peacefully. Then, on the eve of their return to Montana, a group of drunken whiskey traders slaughters forty Nakota—despite Farwell's efforts to stop them. Mary, hiding from the hail of bullets, sees the murderers, including Stiller, take five Nakota women back to their fort. She begs Farwell to save them, and when he refuses, Mary takes two guns, creeps into the fort, and saves the women from certain death. Thus, she sets off a whirlwind of colliding cultures that brings out the worst and best in the cast of unforgettable characters and pushes the love between Farwell and Crow Mary to the breaking point. We are celebrating the 10,000th bed to be delivered soon to a child in the Phoenix area! The Phoenix Chapter began 7 years ago and is still going strong to meet the need of our community.

Thanks to all the donors of time and funds to make this exciting milestone happen. The reason for this effort which improves the lives of children in our community is brought home every time we witness a child receiving a bed for the first time!

We are also fortunate to have a lot of individuals who continue to make blankets and contribute stuffed animals, books and sheets.



Many of us have had Advent calendars where a count-down to Christmas includes opening a small flap which exposes a treat or a surprise of some kind. A reverse Advent box gives us an opportunity to share the joy we experience as we count down the days to the celebration of Christ's birth in a manger. But many of our neighbors experience a worry about having enough food to feed their families throughout the year. A reverse Advent box gives us an opportunity to reach out to those in need by supplying Food Banks with a box of non-perishable items that are most needed. By putting one of the listed items in the supplied box each day during Advent, we

will put into action our command to love our neighbor by helping those who need it most. You can bring your box in any Sunday during December and we will bless them on Christmas eve. They will be transported after Christmas to two Lutheran Social Service Food Banks after Christmas. The list of non-perishable items will be in box and available on the Love of Christ website and in the ENews. Pick up your box beginning Sunday, November 30th and deliver it to the church anytime before Christmas eve. We will be delivering all 100 boxes to the food banks the first week in January.

Love Without Limits meets again on January 7th at 4:30 in Fellowship Hall





Isaiah 35: 1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and shouting. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.

Strengthen the weak hands and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God.

He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense.

He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened.

and the ears of the deaf shall be opened; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy.

For waters shall break forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert:

the burning sand shall become a pool and the thirsty ground springs of water: the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp; the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

A highway shall be there, [S] and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, di but it shall be for God's people: no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it;

they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there.

And the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads;

they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

James 5:7-10

Be patient, therefore, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near. Brothers and sisters, do not grumble against one another, so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors! As an example of suffering and patience, brothers and sisters, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Matthew 11:2-11

When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those with a skin disease are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."

As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What, then, did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What, then, did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written,

'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.'

"Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.
