"Show and Tell"


Following the exciting testimony of the two travelers to Emmaus where they had encountered the risen Lord, we find Jesus among his disciples doing a little show and tell. The disciples are startled and terrified to be in the presence of the resurrected Jesus. They thought they were seeing a ghost. Seeking to calm their racing hearts, he invites them to touch and see he is real, he is alive, he is resurrected. They can exam where the nails and the spear pierced his flesh. Their initial fright is overtaken by joy and wonderment, with a little dose of befuddlement. Jesus lets them see he is the real deal by asking for something to eat. Then Jesus proceeds to teach his followers about all which has happened to fulfill what the scriptures foretold, and they are to be his witnesses. As he shows them that death does not claim the final victory, and they are to be his witnesses to the masses who continue to doubt God's power and love to overcome all things.



When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it!" —Genesis 28:16

Author Barbara Brown Taylor considers how God shows up in all things:

The Bible I set out to learn and love rewarded me with another way of approaching God, a way that trusts the union of spirit and flesh as much as it trusts the world to be a place of encounter with God.... People encounter God under shady oak trees, on riverbanks, at the tops of mountains, and in long stretches of barren wilderness. God shows up in whirlwinds, starry skies, burning bushes, and perfect strangers. When people want to know more about God, the son of God tells them to pay attention to the lilies of the field and the birds of the air, to women kneading bread and workers lining up for their pay....Human beings may separate things into as many piles as we wish—separating spirit from flesh, sacred from secular, church from world. But we should not be surprised when God does not recognize the distinctions we make between the two. Earth is so thick with divine possibility that it is a wonder we can walk anywhere without cracking our shins on altars. 




Winter Friends, thank you for joining us for worship and fellowship this season.

Since 2000, Family Promise of Greater Phoenix has helped families move from homelessness to self-sufficiency. Its vision is a community of whole and healthy families. Parents are given the tools and training to care for their children, find employment and housing, and become independent and successful. FP strives to create a safety net for families before they drop into a cycle of endless shelters, unemployment, family instability, loss of school attendance, and foster care. FP provides food, clothing, and shelter, as well as a supportive and constructive environment. Its long-term goal is to create a sense of community between its families and the many volunteers who assist in some way. Each week of the year, multiple churches host FP families. Each church provides a welcome, an evening meal, overnight shelter, and fellowship.





- 2. Join us in building beds—we welcome all ages, however we kindly ask that any youth under the age of 12 be accompanied and monitored by an adult. Sleep in Heavenly Peace has a new warehouse and workshop with everything set up for bed builds. Bring your family and friends. - 3. Provide twin size bedding—sheets, pillows, blankets, mattress protectors are all needed. (Collection boxes are in the COC and Sanctuary entries.)

Pastor Steve's sermon title: "Show and Tell"

Acts 3:12-19

¹²When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? ¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵ and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you. 17"And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out.

1 John 3:1-7

See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ²Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. 5You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. ⁷Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

Luke 24:36b-48

³⁶While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." 37 They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? 39Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." 40 And when he had said this. he showed them his hands and his feet. 41While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" 42They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³and he took it and ate in their presence. ⁴⁴Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, 47 and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things.


