Larchmont United Methodist Church: Food Locker Trust Annual Report for 2025

The Food Locker Trust (FLT) has completed its 31st full year of operation. In 2025, we served 228 households, which included 779 individuals (475 adults and 304 children), by giving out 504 bags of groceries.

Special thanks to Meg Ditty, Preschool Director, for organizing two Preschool food drives. In May, 250 child friendly food items were collected; in October, over 150 cereal boxes were donated, stocking our breakfast shelf for months.

In November, the FLT received 9 boxes of free canned and packaged food from the Foodbank sponsored Mayflower Marathon food drive.

The FLT sponsors Second Sunday where we ask the congregation to bring in canned or packaged foods for the Food Locker. The FLT also accepts cash donations which are used to purchase food from the Foodbank at a reduced price. Your response to our call for donations this past fall was truly overwhelming and made it possible to meet the needs of every family or individual who requested food assistance.

Many thanks to Claudia Wade and Demi Wheeler for assisting with food pick-up from the Foodbank and restocking the shelves, Nate Poplin for preparing and giving out bags of food and for general recordkeeping, and Carol Regan, Wina Giddens and Cathy Merritt for keeping us well-stocked with bread. Also, special thanks to Gary Chiaverotti for picking up and unloading our share of boxes from the Mayflower Marathon and to Jonathan Clark, Fred Dobbs, and Richard Freeman for loading/unloading cases of food that we purchase from the Foodbank.

The following continue to serve on the FLT Board: Jonathan Clark, Alice Kissell, Pris Peake, Liz Smith and Claudia Wade, along with Pastor Fran Cooper as ex-officio.
