WISE MEN BUILD ON A FIRM FOUNDATION

OUERVIEW

Two men were responsible for building campsites. The first man was tired and did not want to look for a good place to build, so he had his camp built on sandy ground. The second man waited until he found solid ground to support the camp he needed to build. That night, a storm came. The first man's camp began to sink into the sandy ground, but the second man's camp was built on firm ground that withstood the storm. The second man's camp was able to rescue the first man's sinking camp. Wise men build their homes on a firm foundation that will remain solid under pressure. Foolish men build their homes on ground that will sink under pressure.

KEY IDEAS

PATIENCE

Wise people look for a firm foundation, even when it's hard.


FAITHFULNESS

Wise people know that strength and support in the long run are more important than what's easy in the moment. They choose what is right no matter what.

OUERVIEW

Jesus told a story about a Pharisee and a Tax Collector. The Pharisee believed he was better than everyone else while the Tax Collector was someone who helped the Romans cheat the people. Both were wrong, but only one believed he was. The Pharisee looked up to God and thanked God that he wasn't wicked like the Tax Collector. The Tax Collector only looked down and asked for God's mercy and forgiveness. Jesus says that the Tax Collector, not the Pharisee, was justified before God.

KEY IDEAS

HUMILITY

Everyone is a sinner who needs Jesus. No one is better than anyone else.


SALVATION THROUGH GRACE

There is nothing you can do to earn righteousness. That can only come through Jesus.

LUKE 18:9-14

- ⁹ He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt:
- ¹⁰ "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.
- ¹¹ The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed[a] thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector.
- 12 I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.'
- ¹³ But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!'
- ¹⁴ I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

OUERVIEW

Jesus told a story about two brothers and their Father, who was a land owner. The Older Brother worked hard while the younger brother was bored and wanted adventure. The Younger Brother asked his Father for his inheritance and left his Father's home. He traveled around and lived a wild life until he ran out of money. He got a job feeding pigs, but he barely had enough to live. Soon, he decided to return to his Father's home to ask for forgiveness. He hoped his Father would let him return as a servant. When he returned, his Father ran to greet him and welcomed him home. Just as the Father in this story gave his son mercy and grace, God gives us mercy and grace through Jesus.

KEY IDEAS

GRACE

Getting what we don't deserve.

MERCY

Not getting what we do deserve.


UNCONDITIONAL FORGIVENESS

It doesn't matter how far we run or how badly we act. God will always forgive us.

OVERVIEW

People are naturally selfish and sometimes expect God to look like them. Jesus told a story about a good shepherd who had 100 sheep. Everywhere he led them, he would count them. One day, he counted them and found he was missing one. He left the 99 sheep and searched for the missing one until he found it. When he found the lost sheep, he celebrated. Jesus is a good shepherd who will fight for His sheep and lay down His life for them.

KEY IDEAS

SIN NATURF

We were born selfish and must learn to think of others.

PURSUIT

This means that Jesus will seek to find those who are lost until He finds them.


MATTHEW 18:12-14

OUERVIEW

Jesus told a story about a man who found a treasure in a hidden field. He hid it again and tried to buy the property. It had been collected for an unpaid debt. The man would have to pay the debt before he could own the land, so he went and sold everything he had in order to buy the land. Salvation may look like a silly thing to the world, but to those whose hearts have been changed by the Holy Spirit, they are willing to give everything for the joy of knowing they will be with God forever and ever.

KEY IDEAS

SALVATION

This means that we will be with God forever.

SACRIFICE

A word that describes giving up something we love for something even better.

God created people to reflect him in our relationships with him and others.



EATING THE FORBIDDEN FRUIT

OVERVIEW

When God created the world, He said it was good. The world was free of sin, death, and pain. God told Adam and Eve that they could eat from any tree in the garden except for one—the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. He said that the day they ate from it, they would die. As time went by, Adam and Eve were tempted by the tree. One day, Satan, in the form of a Serpent entered the garden and convinced them to eat the fruit. Once they both ate the fruit, they were ashamed and could tell the difference between good and evil. God came and found them in the garden because He knew what they'd done. They had to be separated from Him because of their sin, but He promised to send His son to make right what was broken.

KEY IDEAS

OBEDIENCE

It is important to do what God tells us to do, even if we don't understand why.

SIN

Anything we do that is in direct and deliberate disobedience to what God told us to do.

¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."



OVERVIEW

After Adam and Eve sinned, God promised that the seed of Eve would come and crush the head of the serpent that would save God's people. Many years later, God promised a man named Abram that he would have a son even though, to the world, he and his wife were too old to have children. He promised Abram that his family would be more numerous than the stars in the sky. God changed his name to Abraham, which means "father of many." When Abraham's wife heard that they would have a child in their old age, she laughed, but later that year, she gave birth to a son, Isaac. God kept His promises. He grew the family of Abraham into a great nation. And God fulfilled His ultimate promise and brought His one and only Son. Whoever believes and trusts in Him will not perish but have eternal life.

This means believing in something even when you can't prove it's true.


GOD'S PROMISES

GOD COMMANDS ABRAHAM TO SACRIFICE ISAAC

OUERVIEW

Because of sin, God demands a sacrifice. Before Jesus, people sacrificed animals as a reminder of the cost of sin. After the birth of his son, Isaac, Abraham, God told Abraham to take Isaac to the top of a mountain and offer him as a sacrifice. Isaac asked his father where the lamb was for them to sacrifice, and Abraham told him God would provide the lamb. Just as Abraham raised the blade to sacrifice Isaac, God provided a ram in Isaac's place. God did not mean for Abraham to go through with the sacrifice. Instead, He wanted to paint a picture. Abraham would not sacrifice His child of promise, but God would. God would give His only begotten Son, Jesus, to be sacrificed on our behalf.

KEY IDEAS

SACRIFICE

This is when somebody or something gives up what they have so another can be made right.


GOD'S PROVISION

OUERVIEW

It can be easy to question the truth of God's promises when they feel like they take too long to come true.


GOD'S BUSINESS
