- O Are selfish
- Aren't submissive towards authority and leadership

Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit.

- Gossip
- Slander
- Lying
- Exaggerating
- Complaining or grumbling
- Manipulation and emotionalism
- Flattery
- Blameshifting or making excuses
- Being "raw" and having no filter in what we say
- Ignoring someone
- Assuming the worst of others
