Can God Use Satan's Evil For Good?

Examples Of What The Enemy Wants You To Think:

- I'm damaged goods, so no one will ever want me
- I'm worthless because my parents didn't love me
- I deserve the abuse because everyone abuses me
- God must not love me because humans hurt me
- Give up, I'm a lost cause
- I've failed one too many times
- I don't deserve a normal life
- I'll never be better off than I am now
- No one loves me
- God's promises are only for other people
- How could anyone ever love me?

God's Truth Says:

1. Satan is a liar and the father of lies.
 - a. Satan only influences you when you believe him.
 - b. Satan's lies come to us in the form of thoughts, other's words, or inherited beliefs.
 - c. Scripture is a great antidote to these lies (when not taken out of context).
 - d. "When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies." (John 8:44)
2. We were purchased by Christ's sacrifice so He could redeem us from the curse of sin.



- a. Satan lost his ability to determine our futures when Jesus died on the cross to redeem us from our sins.
 - b. "Jesus bought us with a price, the blood of Jesus Christ" (I Cor 6:20)
 - c. "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us...He redeemed us in order that ... by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit. (Gal 3:13-15)
3. Jesus made a final purchase if we believe in Him and accept his adoption.
- a. "He predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will." (Eph 1:5)
 - b. Satan got access to us through sin so he could torment us in our spirits, souls, and bodies, but he lost those rights when Jesus died on the cross for our sins and Father God adopted us into His family.
 - c. "Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory." (Romans 8:17)

Questions To Help You Process This Concept:

1. What destructive beliefs have you accepted as true? Even when scripture says otherwise?
2. Satan does harm through other people's choices so that he can persuade us that we are hopeless. Who has hurt you in a way that feels like permanent damage?



3. Are there areas of sin or brokenness in your life that you believe permanently separate you from God's love or healing? What are they?

4. Have you found a trusted pastor, counselor or mentor who can help you identify lies that are holding you back from healing? Who could you talk to about your hidden damage?

5. Have you started believing that you are truly a child of God with all the love and belonging that you are entitled to? If not, why not?

1. Read scriptures on the next page before answering these questions.
2. Ask a trusted friend to walk you through this exercise.
3. What areas of your life feel hopeless or worthless? (Identify specifics)
4. Ask God to help you add to this list from your past and childhood.
5. For every negative you wrote down, find at least one scripture in the list on the next page that speaks God's truth into that situation.

- I am God's child (John 1:12)
- I am Christ's friend (John 15:15)
- I have been bought with a price; I am not my own; I belong to God (1 Cor. 6:19,20)
- I have been established, anointed and sealed by God in Christ, and I have been given the Holy Spirit as a pledge guaranteeing my inheritance to come (2 Cor. 1:21; Eph. 1:13,14)
- I have been redeemed and forgiven. The debt against me has been canceled (Col. 1:14)
- I am hidden with Christ in God (Col. 3:3)
- I have been saved and set apart according to God's doing (2 Tim. 1:9; Titus 3:5)
- He is not ashamed to call me brother (Heb. 2:11)
- I am a member of Christ's body (1 Cor. 12:27; Eph. 5:30)
- I am an heir of God since I am a child of God (Gal. 4:6,7)

He has made you secure:

- I am a citizen of heaven, seated in heaven right now (Phil. 3:20; Eph. 2:6)
- I am free forever from condemnation (Rom. 8:1)
- I have been blessed with every spiritual blessing (Eph. 1:3)
- I may approach God with boldness, freedom and confidence (Eph. 3:12)
- I have been rescued from the domain of Satan's rule and transferred to the kingdom of Christ (Col. 1:13)
- I am firmly rooted in Christ and am now being built in Him (Col. 2:7)

He has made you significant:

- I am a saint (Eph. 1:1; 1 Cor. 1:2; Phil. 1:1; Col. 1:2)
- I am the salt of the earth (Matt. 5:13)
- I am the light of the world (Matt. 5:14)
- I am part of the true vine, a channel of Christ's life (John 15:1,5)
- I am chosen by Christ to bear His fruit (John 15:16)
- I was chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy (Eph. 1:4)
- I am a minister of reconciliation (2 Cor. 5:17-20)
- I have the right to come boldly before the throne of God to find mercy and grace in time of need (Heb. 4:16)
