You Don't Need a Mirror

Looked in the mirror lately? Chances are you have. In fact, studies suggest we look into the mirror as many as thirty or forty times a day. That's almost as many times as we glance at our phones - almost, but thankfully not quite. Still, it's a lot, an indispensable part of our daily routine. It's one of the first things we do when we wake up and one of the last things we make sure of before we leave the house. Why so much? It was just seven or eight hours earlier that we went to bed. Did we think things were going to change so profoundly that we wouldn't recognize ourselves in the morning? And besides that, at my age whenever I look into the mirror it's kind of disappointing. For me, the routine begins after morning exercise and I've had some coffee. Before I place the razor to my face I check the topography it is about to assail. Often, I find a new line that has etched itself onto my face, and where did that gray hair come from? And then to find out that mirrors do not necessarily even accurately reflect what you look like. Did you know lighting has as much effect on what you think you see as does your mirror? It has always been thus.

Remember what the Apostle Paul said, "We see as in a mirror dimly." (1 Corinthians 13). In the time of Paul, a mirror wasn't made of glass - instead was highly polished metal that would give you a general but not perfect reflection of yourself.

That's why in scripture most people are not described by their faces. Did you know there is no physical description of what Jesus looked like in the Bible? Was his face round or linear, his hair brown or black? We don't know. We guess based on general Mideastern archetypes but we don't know. In the Bible, to describe a person you don't often look at the face but a person's traits. For instance, in our scripture for this Sunday, Luke 13:10-17, a person stands before Jesus. What do we know? That she is a woman, crippled, unable to stand straight and she has had the condition for 18 years. Nothing else. We don't know her age, the color of her hair or her complexion.

You want to know who you are? Think about how people describe you. That is a more accurate description than what you simply look like. Does what you think about yourself match the person others describe you to be?

That is the subject of the sermon Sunday.




