

Baptism Sunday


There are many things I enjoy about the ministry. I mean, where else would I get my ties if not for the Wesley Yard Sale?! Seriously, however, the administration of the Sacraments is what I appreciate most of all. In some traditions, as many as seven Sacraments are practiced. In the United Methodist Church there are only two - communion and baptism. To qualify as a Sacrament, the rite must see Jesus as an indispensable part of its action. That is why, for instance, marriage, while a powerful ritual, is not considered a sacrament. Jesus was there in Canaan of Galilee, but his impression was made in the miracle he performed, not the marriage he attended. Communion is a sacrament because Jesus tore the bread and shared the cup. And baptism is sacred because water fell on him as it now falls on us.

There is another reason I appreciate the sacraments. They require me to focus on that which is immediately before me, no longer distracted by other thoughts. You cannot offer communion without anticipating the person stretching out their hand to receive the bread. And you cannot baptize someone without seeing their faces, the innocence of an infant or the expectation of an adult. There is something powerful in such interactions; they require full attention. And when it happens, I feel God close, and that is a sacred moment.

Once, following a baptism, an adult came up to me and said, "I wish I could be baptized again." I asked why and he said because it would mean so much more now than all those years ago then. I patiently explained we don't rebaptize because it is a ritual born of God and not us. He understood and then said, "Yeah, but I still wish I could have that experience again."

That's why this Sunday in the service there will be a moment when you will be invited to stand at the baptismal font, you, the water and God before you, and place the moisture on your head and remember that you are baptized and that you belong to God. It is a powerful moment and I invite you to share in it this Sunday. There is nothing else quite like it.

REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM



The act of baptism is a United Methodist sacrament, originating in Jesus' baptism. Baptism is not just a cleansing from sin, it is a sign of discipleship. The water is an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace. It cleanses us from sin in God's grace, and it also purifies us for a new life of loving God and serving in Jesus' name. Jesus was baptized before he began his public ministry. This tells us something about how Jesus' power originated: as a proclamation from God, identifying him as 'Beloved Son.' So whether your parents wanted to share the joy of Christian identity with you, or if you decided you wanted that yourself, baptism is a mark of who you are.

People often want to be "re-baptized" after a significant spiritual encounter - they want to mark that moment as a renewal of not going back into a sinful life. But in the United Methodist church, we believe God's grace is the one doing the baptizing, not us. So we "remember" our baptism each year, as a way of recommitting our lives to Christ. It is a renewal of life, as we let go of all that has been, and the mistakes we have made, to let Jesus' power of love lead us and the identity we have in Christ become us. This is why we do a renewal of baptism on the second Sunday of each year on "Baptism of the Lord Sunday."
