When Losing Is Winning

During these dog days of summer, taking the trash to the curb feels like a walk through a desert. There is this one saving grace, however. The start of football practices. You know, that time of year when players put on crisp clean pads, and every team thinks they've got a chance to win it all. Soon enough, exuberance will give to fatigue. Hope will suffer injury and reality sets in - most often described as losing. It isn't pretty.

That's why I found the interview with Amanda Anisimova so refreshing. You know, the American tennis player who abysmally lost in straight sets at Wimbledon. Ignominiously, she became only the second player in Wimbledon history to score not even a single point in a finals match. It wasn't fun. Afterwards, Anisimova reflected on her loss and vowed, "I will learn and come out stronger from this experience."

Psychologist Amy Edmondson has written that there are essentially two kinds of failure. There is a failure that occurs because an error has been made, something got left out of the calculation - a word, a decimal or a comma. Those are failures mostly of oversight, and we all make them. The other kind of failure is more nuanced. It is what is called "intelligent failure." It's when you are sure of something and then you find out you are wrong. And if you learn from this, you recalibrate what you thought was true, open yourself up to a new idea and become better for the experience. This is the kind of failure that asks you to look into your own soul and ask questions like, "What am I really all about?" or "What really matters?" These are the questions that get us to change our mind, and more importantly, change our life. These questions are usually accompanied by bumps and bruises and do not get well overnight but make you better in the end. Not all losses are the same.

Jesus said something similarly, "In order to gain your life you must first lose it."
