Real Life

Did you see where two cultural icons exited the scene stage right last week? Warren Buffett and Gregg Popovich. I suspect you are familiar with the names. Warren Buffett, the Oracle of Ohama, who started trading stocks in his teens and now retires (some would say prematurely) as the chairman of Berkshire-Hathaway at the age of 94. His acumen turned the company he created into a trillion dollar behemoth whose reach is deep and wide, extending from Coca-Cola to Appel. Gregg Popvich (also known as Pop) is the winningest coach in professional basketball history. His career began in, of all places, Pomona College, hardly known for its athletics. Pomona was and still is not an NCAA-run Division 1 school. It's not even Division 2 – it's 3! I know this because they competed with my alma mater, though truth be told I never saw the coach because I never went to a game; most of the student body didn't. Those schools don't give athletic scholarships - they feel fortunate if they have enough jerseys to pass around to the players. It was hardly an auspicious beginning. Now, Coach Popovich retires standing above all others– amazing.

What I found extraordinary in these two singular individuals of accomplishment was how similar and simple their recipe for success was. When someone asked Popovich how he did it he said, "Draft Tim Duncan, after that stay alive." And Buffett modestly mentions advice from a friend who told him, "Buy great companies." That's it.

So how come we don't all just do that? Could it be because we all hear that siren call? We want instant success and ask it to include a touch of notoriety as well. Our culture has exchanged character for celebrity, and we are worse for it. One of the great unheralded attributes of faith is its practice. Belief, like most things, takes time to be acquired. Its bent is towards integrity, not compromise or lazy luck. I guess what I am saying is real faith is not a part time job; it requires our whole self. And what do we get in return? New life - is there anything better?

She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue...Her children arise and call her blessed. Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. Proverbs 31:25-26, 28, 30

We talk about Jesus' mother, Mary, a lot. But what about Mary's mother? Someone had to raise Mary to find favor with God. Someone had to raise Mary to treasure purity. Someone had to raise Mary to honor Joseph. Someone had to raise Mary to know the voice of the Lord, even though they were living in the silent years. Mary's mother, we don't know her name.
