An Antidote for Troubling Times

Recent events have sadly reminded us that we live in a divided world that feels evermore dangerous. It is troubling and most distressing; worse, there seems to be no end in sight. That's because the instinctive human response to seek revenge perpetuates conflict rather than stops it. Most surprising, it is a useless exercise that wastes energy and offers diminished return in relation to the initial transgression. How is that exactly? Because the whole notion of revenge is predicated on the past and therefore has no relationship to the present or certainly the future. It is impossible to get literal revenge because you cannot go back to that exact moment and replicate it no matter how hard you try. The motivation of revenge is to "get even." The trouble is, "getting even" is a myth. Losing something, especially life, cannot be simply replaced, and it doesn't matter how much money or resource you have. How much money is a life worth? It is a ridiculous question. There is no finite approximation for it. We are sacredly made and have no capacity for what only God can do. Worse still, studies suggest revenge is like a drug, addictive and destructive, providing at its best momentary pleasure but never addressing the real loss.

So what are we to do with this moment of helplessness and hopelessness? I know this will surprise you coming from your preacher and all, but have you considered what would Jesus do? Specifically, his instruction on forgiveness. We sometimes think of forgiveness as a nice idea but an impractical notion. In fact, the idea of revenge is what makes no sense. Forgiveness weighs the gravity of the moment and determines that the best path forward is trusting in God. Not an easy thing, this "Thy Will, not mine be done;" it just happens to be basis of what we believe. Now, if we will just do it. Hard as it is to practice, forgiveness remains our only hope.


