Title: Disciple Making (Discussion class)

Have you ever wanted to study the Bible one-on-one with someone but didn't know where to start?

We've all heard the Great Commission—to go and make disciples—but how many of us are actively living it out? What holds us back? Is it fear of not knowing enough? Fear of rejection? Worry about how it might affect our relationships?

The truth is, we all have our reasons—or excuses. But what if you were given hands-on training and practical tools to confidently share your faith and walk with someone toward Jesus? Title: Introduction to New Testament Teacher: Tim Theiss, Derek Dunbar, Larry Cline (115A)

We are continuing our new series **Foundations in Christianity**. This series is designed for folks with little to no Bible experience, but open to anyone who would like a "refresher" in

the basics of the Bible and our core beliefs. We will be continuing an *Introduction to the Old Testament* through August focusing on the overarching narrative of the Old Testament and how these stories combine to help us understand and anticipate Jesus Christ. An *Introduction to the New Testament* highlighting our Lord Jesus will begin in September and continue through the end of 2025. Then we'll continue with a class detailing our core beliefs called *Hardin Valley: Who we Are* (formerly called Hardin Valley 101). The final class in this series will be taught beginning in January 2026.

Title: Galatians

Title: History of Christianity Teacher: Jay Pannell (112-113A)

Have you ever pondered the origins of Biblical inerrancy, or how Christianity shaped the United States' founders? Perhaps you've wondered about the significance of monasteries and saints, or what lessons the medieval church holds for us today. How did the Pope ascend to his position as "first among equals," and what's the story behind convents? Who decided which words and books formed the Christian creed and canon? How did early Christian apologists articulate their worldview to the scholars of their time? What made Paul so successful?

The details of the dead past, the dogmas borne of "corpse-cold orthodoxy," are not merely arcane trinkets to be collected by the theological nerd. They are worth taking seriously, not only in the past, but as guides for who we, Christians, have been and don't want to be again; or reminders of what we've lost and need to recover (or run away from like the plague).

By reflecting on the evolutionary landscape of Christian History, we can strengthen our faith in times of uncertainty, rather than allowing it to be diminished. I hope that this journey through history will deepen your faith as you recognize the vastness of the "great cloud of witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1).
