Title: Disciple Making (Discussion class)

We are continuing our new series Foundations in Christianity. This series is designed for folks with little to no Bible experience, but open to anyone who would like a "refresher" in the basics of the Bible and our core beliefs. will be continuing an Introduction to the Old Testament through August focusing on the overarching narrative of the Old Testament and how these stories combine to help us understand and anticipate Jesus Christ.
