WORSHIP IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

- Where is the temple in the New Testament? We are the temple.
- Why is the body (both us individually and the collective church) the temple? The Holy Spirits dwells in us.
- Who are the priests that offer the sacrifices? We are the priests.

- When is the worship performed? All the time.

WHY ASSEMBLE TOGETHER?

- If all of our life is worship, what is the reason we worship together in the corporate assembly of God's people.
- Why can't we just go up on the mountain top or to our prayer closet to draw closet to God?
- If we worship God and show Him honor and respect by doing good and serving others why should we assemble?



WHY ASSEMBLE TOGETHER?

- Hebrews 10:24-25
- ²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.
- Why does this verse say we need to assemble (meet together)?



WHY ASSEMBLE TOGETHER?

- I Corinthians 14:26
- ²⁶ What then, brothers? When you come together, each one has a hymn, a lesson, a revelation, a tongue, or an interpretation. Let all things be done for building up.
- Why does this verse say we need to assemble (come together)?

ASSEMBLY WORDS

- Sunagō (sun = together + agō = to bring) "to assemble"
 "gathering together" of people or things. (Acts 11:26)
- Sunerchoai (sun = together + erchoai = to come) "to come together frequently us of the gathering of the local church. (1 Cor. 11:17-34; 1 Cor. 14:23, 26; Heb. 10:25)

ASSEMBLY WORDS

• Ekklesia – (ek = out + klesis = a calling) – An assembly (called out to assemble). Was used among the Greeks of a body of citizens "gathered" to discuss the affairs of state (Acts 19:39). A gathering of Israel. For Christians refers to a) the redeemed throughout the present era (Matt 16:18; Eph. 1:22) and b) in singular a company of professed believers in a locality and in plural churches in a district.

WHAT DID THE EARLY CHURCH DO WHEN THEY ASSEMBLED?

- Acts 2:42 And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.
- Acts 2:44-45 And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need.
- Acts 2:46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts,
