

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE | 1 Kings 2:1-4; 3:3-15

SESSION SUMMARY

Solomon was David's son, the one God intended to take the throne after his father—and the one God intended to build the temple. When Solomon did take the throne, God told him to make a request, and He didn't give Solomon any perameters. Still, Solomon chose wisdom to lead God's people, and God gave him that. Through David's words to Solomon and Solomon's conversation with God, Scripture shows us that our faith makes a lasting impact, even if we don't see it. Here are the main takeaways:

- Our faithfulness leaves a legacy (1 Kings 2:1-4).
- We must pursue wisdom (1 Kings 3:3-15).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- · Where do we tend to think wisdom comes from? Why?
- · What does the word "legacy" mean? How would we describe our family's legacy?
- · How can our family open our hearts to God's wisdom to leave a legacy of faith?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

We all probably have funny sayings our families have passed down or our friends have taught us. Wisdom works similarly. Allow parents or guardians to share both funny sayings and a piece of wisdom passed down through their families. Invite students to share anything different they've heard or learned from family or close friends. Then ask each person to share one Bible verse that has taught them God's wisdom. Wrap up your time together by writing down all of these funny and wise sayings and Bible verses. Get them out from time to time to review them and see how you're following the wisdom God has given you.
