

Diabetes mellitus, commonly known simply as diabetes, is a disease that causes high blood sugar. There is a hormone in the body called insulin, that moves sugar from the blood into your cells to be stored or used for energy. When a person has diabetes, their body either doesn't make enough insulin or can't effectively use the insulin it does make. Untreated or uncontrolled high blood sugar from diabetes can damage your nerves, eyes, kidneys, and other organs.

SYMPTOMS

Most common symptoms of diabetes include:

- · Increased hunger and thirst
- Frequent urination
- · Blurry vision
- Extreme fatigue/tiredness
- · Sores that are slow to heal

Symptoms may also differ for men and women. Men may experience erectile dysfunction or poor muscle strength. Women may experience urinary tract infections (UTI), yeast infections, or dry itchy skin.

QUICK FACTS

Type 1 The cause of Type 1 diabetes is not exactly understood, but it is an autoimmune disease. This means that your immune system attacks the pancreas and destroys cells. Insulin is made in the pancreas, so there is often little to no insulin produced in the body. Genes may play a role.

Type 2 In Type 2 diabetes, your body becomes resistant to insulin, and this allows sugar to build up in your blood. The cause of Type 2 diabetes is a combination of genetics and lifestyle.

African Americans and Hispanics are over 50% more likely to have diabetes than non-Hispanic whites.

RISK FOR DIABETES INCREASES IF:

- You have a parent or sibling with diabetes
- You have high blood pressure or high cholesterol
- You are African American, Hispanic or Latino
- You aren't physically active
- · You are overweight
- You are 45 years old or older
