- The opportunity is still open for you to make your financial assessment for Women's Day. Our goal of \$25,000 will go towards our continued capital improvement efforts.






REV. DR. SAMMIE LOGAN, III • PASTOR'S ANNIVERSARY GUEST PREACHER

Rev. Dr. Sammie L. Logan, III, is a native of Norfolk, Virginia. As the grandson of a powerful Pentecostal preacher, Sammie would spend many days in a Catholic School but many nights in a Pentecostal church. It was these regular complementary experiences that ultimately led him to seek to know God in a personal way at a very young age.

It was during his junior year in college that Sammie began to embrace a call to ministry. After graduating from Morehouse College, Sam earned a Master's Degree in Education from The College of William & Mary followed by a Master's Degree in Divinity from the Samuel D. BREAST CANCER

Breast cancer is a type of cancer that starts in the breast. Breast cancer cells usually form a tumor that can often be seen on an x-ray or felt as a lump.

It's important to understand that most breast lumps are benign (non-cancerous). Non-cancerous breast tumors are abnormal growths, but they do not spread outside of the breast, like a malignant (cancerous) tumor can. Any breast lump or change needs to be checked by a health care provider to determine if it is benign or malignant.

QUICK FACTS

- Breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed among women in the United States.
- Breast cancer occurs almost entirely in women, but men can get breast cancer too.
- + Regular screening is the best way to find breast cancer.
- Talk with your health care provider about your options!

RISK FACTORS FOR BREAST CANCER

Some risk factors for breast cancer include:

- Age. Most breast cancers are found in women age 55 and older.
- Family history. Having a first-degree relative (mother, sister, daughter) with breast cancer.
- Gender. Being a female increases risk.
- Race and ethnicity. White women are slightly more likely to develop breast cancer than African-American women, although the gap has been closing.

BREAST CANCER TREATMENT

Treatment can include surgery, chemo, radiation, hormone therapy, immunotherapy, and targeted drug therapy.

SCREENING AND EARLY DETECTION

Women have the option to be screened from the ages of 40-44 and should get mammograms every year from the ages of 45-54.

Women 55 and older can switch to a mammogram every other year, or they can choose to continue yearly mammograms.

Women at a high risk for breast cancer can start getting screened as early as age 30.
