Approval of minutes and bills: Motion to approve by Heather seconded by Angie.

Reports:

Preschool Report: Anne Wilcox provided a report. So far everything has been going well. She did order some paper to replenish the supply. There are currently 12 students in the Tuesday/Thursday classes, and 8 students in the Monday/Wednesday/Friday classes. Regarding the flooring in the classroom; estimates have been or will be gathered and it will be voted on at the next Voter's Meeting in December, and have a goal of next summer if it is approved.

Sunday School Report: Due to lack of students and scheduling conflicts Sunday School has not currently been occurring. We will try Sunday School at 10 am next Sunday.

Annie will discuss with Brent Sinsel the plan for the older kids.

Unfinished Business:

Fall Kick-Off, Tuesday Night Classes, and Fall Sunday School – Currently there is no plan for Fall Kick-Off, Tuesday Night classes or Fall Sunday School. Services are currently Sunday and Tuesdays. Again, attendance to Tuesday night classes is limited. Confirmation students are attending classes at Our Redeemer.

Compassion Child – Currently it has not been paid since May. We will discuss with Charlene if payment has been caught up, or if our child has been picked up by someone else. If she has, we will not pick up a new one as currently we do not have Sunday School donations to cover the cost. It was currently set at \$50.00 a month.

New Business: -

Our next meeting will be scheduled for Oct. 12th, 10:00 am.

Kerrin made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Heather second. Motion carried.



Board of Elders Meeting

September 8, 2025

The meeting was opened at 7:06pm with a prayer led by Larry Wallace.

IN ATTENDANCE: Leland Poppe, Larry Wallace, John Flynn, Rod Christmann, Glen Van Velson, and Allen Huff. Bob Lantis joined the meeting at 7:19 PM. Leland Poppe chaired the meeting.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES : John Flynn moved that the August 11TH minutes be approved. Rod Christmann seconded the motion. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Leland reported that Ashley Roehrs had been invited by the council president at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church (ORLC) to fill the open position on the Board of Directors for Our Redeemer Lutheran School. Ashley has stated that she is willing to serve on that board. Glenn Van Velson moved to approve Ashley's appointment to that board, with the thanks of the Elders of Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church (BSLC). Larry Wallace seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Board of Elders' Financial Report, the Treasurer's Report, and a sheet listing the National Youth Gathering (NYG) expenses were provided for review. There were no bills that required Elders' approval. Future NYG trip budgets and options for financing them were discussed.

The compensation package for Pastor Peterson to serve as the Lead Vacancy Pastor, along with Pastor Stubenrouch as the other Vacancy Pastor, was discussed. Pastor Peterson will cover the first, third, and any fifth Sundays of each month; along with serving at BSLC on each Tuesday. With Pastor Stubenrouch covering the second and fourth Sundays. Glenn Van Velson moved that the salary for Pastor Peterson be set at \$2,000 a month and that mileage would be paid separately at the approved Internal Revenue Service rate for miles driven. (Rate is currently \$0.70 per mile.) Said compensation is to be effective starting September 1ST. Allen Huff seconded the motion. Motion carried. (As a reminder, one Tuesday of each month, Pastor Peterson meets with the other members of his circuit. Those meetings are typically in the mornings and Pastor Peterson intends to come to BSLC to serve those Tuesday afternoons and evenings.)

Glenn Van Velson moved that we have communion during the worship service on the fifth Sundays of the month, and that we also have communion during the Tuesday evening worship services that follow the fifth Sundays of the month. Larry Wallace seconded the motion. Motion carried.

After the joint service with ORLC, last summer, an offer was made by ORLC to consider having a joint service on more of the fifth Sundays. One option would be to alternate between having the service at ORLC and at BSLC. Some more discussion will need to take place to work out details, but this will be looked at in the future.

There was discussion about Elder visits with members of the congregation. Leland will ask Ruth to provide a list of members, generated from the Shepard's Staff database. Pastor Peterson will be approached about providing some guidance/training on how to best conduct the visits with members.

NEW BUSINESS : Sunday School classes for the young members of BSLC were discussed. Some concern was expressed by several Elders. The general feeling is that classes should be held on Sunday mornings with regularity, for the benefit of the children and the long-term health of the congregation. The feeling about Tuesday evening classes was that after the worship service would probably be too late for the younger children. Another concern was that there has not been a plan published for a Rally Sunday. The Elders would assist with Rally Sunday activities if needed.

Similar concerns were expressed about the youth of BSLC. The Elders are not aware of details about planned activities since the National Youth Gathering.

The Elder's Budget for 2026 was discussed, and a few needed changes, from the 2025 Budget, were noted.

Rod Christmann reported on the activities of the Cottage Bible Studies. Rod will put out some feelers to see if there is any interest in additional groups getting started.

Rod reported that a concern about the monthly newsletters not being mailed out had been brought to him. Due to bulk mail service no longer being available in the North Platte area, the current process of placing them in member's in-house mailboxes will continue.

It was brought forward, that a letter had been received from Chelsea Irwin, who is a missionary with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. She would be glad to give talks to preschool classes, worship services, or Bible study groups. She will be in the Lexington/Gothenburg area in December. She is volunteering to come to BSLC to give talks on the mission work, on December 2ND (a Tuesday) or on December 6TH (a Saturday). The consensus was that we should check and see what time of day she would be available on December 2ND.

Glenn Van Velson moved to adjourn. Bob Lantis seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:51 PM, with the Lord's Prayer.

Church Council Minutes

09/21/2025

Those present: Mike Steele, Kim Utecht, Ashley Roehrs, Andrew Van Velson, Sharon Lantis Ron Asher, and Leland Poppe.

Mike opened with prayer.

Minutes: There were no minutes from last month.

Treasurer's report was given by Mike. Congregation member requested a full set of financial reports. Mike will work with Charlene and Ruth to get a full set. A donation was made to the Charles Schwab account which is used in General Account unless specified. SubSplash (3 preschool students using this account to pay tuition) and Joyful Response are two ways to give on line.

Elders Report: M-W-F Preschool there are 8 students and T-Th 12 students. Appreciated church members who showed up first day of school. Ruth printed church directory of active members only. October is Pastor Appreciation Month. Andrew reported on the conversation he had with Pastor Stubenrouch. Pastor Stubenrouch is still willing to serve our church although he is concerned about his health to serve our church. He was encouraged to still serve Beautiful Savior until he felt he couldn't serve anymore. This information was passed on to a couple Elders. We were not anticipating Pastor Stubenrouch serving our congregation for three years. When the snow flies, we will not be able to expect Pastor Stubenrouch to come.

Board of Education, Ashley was asked by Our Redeemer to serve on their Board of Education. Mike appointed her to serve on the Board of Education at Our Redeemer. Sunday school is on Sunday's at 10:00. With the changes from Wednesdays to Tuesdays not many students were showing up on Tuesdays. There are no mid-week classes. Students are combined with Our Redeemer mid-week classes and 6th graders are included. There are 15 to 19 students attending mid-week classes. A compassion child was discussed. This student's tuition was supposed to come out of budget, was not notified that the bill has not been paid.

Trustees: Floor of preschool was discussed. Need to wait until the end of school year to replace the flooring in preschool but discussed probably an overlay. Two or three bids have been received. Trustees need someone with expertise to do it. Need to take to voters meeting for budget purposes.

Board of Outreach: None

Board of Youth: Andrew reported that Tara is contacting former confirmation students so they can find interested students and encourage more students to attend youth group.

Planning Committee: No report.

Call Committee is meeting right after council meeting. There are 14 candidates, one name was given to the congregation outside of the District but is included in these 14 candidates.

Council and Boards Planning Session: Nothing to report.

Voter's Meeting: Ruth needs to give boards their needs for budgets. Voter's meeting will be November 16th at 2:00 pm and call meeting will follow. October 19th boards will have to have their budgets in and have them ready for the congregation by November 2nd.

November voters: Need to discuss potential amendments to the by-laws. Need to adjust majority to change by-law. Need to have at least 143 voters or 30% to change by-laws.

Have not heard from BOOM Committee about Trunk or Treat.

Another discussion needs to be brought before voters to see whether to fix the bell tower and get new equipment. Decide what budget to come out of.

Andrew made motion to adjourn and seconded by Ashley. Motion carried.

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Cottage Bible Studies

A Cottage Bible study is a vital aspect of spiritual growth and community for believers. It creates an environment for belief and behavior change, transforms families and communities, and provides accountability and support. By studying the Bible together, believers can deepen their understanding of God's Word and apply it to their lives, fostering a sense of fellowship and belonging.

A Cottage Bible Study is a small group (usually 4-12 adults from various walks of life) meeting regularly by prioritizing the Word and prayer in community together.

The structure is determined by your group... once a week, every other week, once a month, you decide.

What you study is determined by your group. There are several resources on the book shelves in the foyer and also on the app under Family Entertainment, SubSplash premium library.

The location is determined by your group. In a home, at a coffee shop, or even at the church if needed.
