The Word and the Sacraments

Our church services are divided into two distinct sections: The Service of the Word and the Service of the Sacrament. In the case of a baptism, it is customary to baptize at the beginning of the service with the Rite of Baptism, replacing the Corporate Confession and Absolution for that day.

But in general there is this one division present at every service, the Word and the Sacraments. In the Service of the Word, we hear small portions from every part of the Scriptures. We always hear a Psalm, and usually two. We have an Old Testament reading, an Epistle reading, and a Holy Gospel reading. This is not so that the preacher has several texts to choose from. We read the Scriptures during the Service of the Word specifically because we are hearing from the whole counsel of God every single week. That is a treasure that we should not neglect. And we use a lectionary (a collection of readings) not because it is old, but because the lectionary readings have been chosen to explain one another. It is the doctrine of Sola Scriptura, that is, Scripture alone, that we emphasize here. What I mean is that all the readings relate to one another.

Think of the First Sunday in Advent. You have Zechariah 9:9-12 which serves as the prophecy directly about Palm Sunday, which is the Gospel reading appointed for that day. Or think of Christmas. You have Isaiah 7 which prophecies about a son born of the virgin named Immanuel, and then you have the Gospel reading of Luke 2 that describes that Son of God, Son of Mary who is born in Bethlehem in the manger.

After the Service of the Word where we hear the Scriptures, Old and New Testament, Law and Gospel, and so much more, then we celebrate the Service of the Sacrament. And this Sacrament is to be celebrated according to the Word of the Lord. The Word and the Sacrament serve one another. The Word strengthens faith; the Sacrament sustains that faith. The Sacrament is the Word made flesh for our souls. The Sacrament is the clearest example of God's presence among us and in us in His Body and His Blood.

But I recently remembered one of my sermons from last year regarding this. I don't think at the time that I realized just how comforting that sermon was. Certainly the Word and the Sacraments are deeply comforting for us, but my point in that sermon was that it is only the Word and the Sacraments that we experience now that we will experience also eternally in heaven.

We do not take our gold with us when we die. We do not take our tables or chairs or any of our possessions. Now we certainly do pray every day that our children will be with us for all eternity and we ought to make every sacrifice in order to provide the comfort of eternal life for those who we love the most.

But all the books in the world will pass away, but the Word of our Lord will not pass away. That Reformation phrase based off of Isaiah 55 rings true: the Word of the Lord endures forever. All our Facebook posts, all our ideas we write on our napkins, all our files and photos and letters and newspapers will not last through the Last Day, but God's Word will be both the last Word we hear and the first Word that we hear for all eternity.

And the Sacraments are the same. In Baptism, you join God's eternal family. It is this precious gift that marks you as God's child forever and ever. We sometimes sin and fail and fall away, but God's promise to you never fails and never expires. Baptism is an eternal gift for our souls.

And the Lord's Supper is the same for us. It is the meal of eternal life. Check out John 6 sometime. And listen to the words of "This is the feast." Reread the words of Christ (Matthew 26) when He commands that this supper be celebrated, some of His very last words before He died on the cross for our sins. Sing "At the Lamb's High Feast We sing." Read Revelation 4-5. The Sacrament of the Altar is an eternal gift for our souls.

Everything else pales in comparison to these two things: the Word and the Sacraments. There are any number of distractions in the world, but it all fades away. What remains is our Lord Jesus Christ risen from the dead and living and reigning through His Church as we hear God's Word and receive God's Sacraments.

May this help you to cherish our services and prepare your hearts for the eternal gifts offered at our church every Sunday. And as we prepare for another Church Year, consider how these two, the Word and the Sacrament, shape your faith and your trust in your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Unfinished business

The Board of Elders' Financial Report and the Treasurer's Report were reviewed. There were no bills that required Elders' approval.

There was discussion about Elder visits with members of the congregation. The list of Inactive Members, generated from the Shepard's Staff database, was passed around. Teams of two Elders each were formed and each selected four or five families to visit; as appointments can be scheduled.

The Proposed Elder's Budget for 2026, which was developed at the previous meeting, was briefly discussed.

The date of November 29, for decorating the church, was discussed. No specific team, to represent the Elders for decorating, was designated. At least two of the Elders will be traveling due to the Thanksgiving holiday, however some of the Elder's present indicated that they would help with the decorating.

New business

Relative to the call issued to him; Pastor Hahn, of Peoria, Illinois will be in North Platte on Thursday to check on the housing situation and the services available in the area. Mike Steele is facilitating his visit.

Ruth will not be in the church office, due to the need for surgery, from December 4TH through December 10TH. To facilitate her recovery and therapy, she will work short hours the remainder of December.

There was discussion about worship service media, music, and scheduling. One idea presented is that even with a full time, called pastor, we might benefit from staying with one service on Sunday mornings, probably mid-morning.

There was a consensus of opinion on having just one worship service Christmas Eve and one service Christmas Day.

Adjournment

Leland adjourned the meeting at 8:42 PM, and it closed with the Lord's Prayer being recited.

Beautiful Savior Voters Meeting

November 16, 2025

Attendance sheet attached.

Mike Steele called the meeting to order at 2:05

Mike opened with prayer.

Minutes from Council meeting from October, call meeting minutes from October and last voters meeting minutes from April were presented as printed. Andrew Van Velson moved and seconded by Marilyn Sinsel to approve council meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Glenn Van Velson moved and seconded by Jim Parish to approve call meeting minutes with one correction to put Dr Boettcher's motion to unanimously cast a ballot for Pastor Hahn before the sentence "paper ballots were handed out". Motion carried.

Moved by John Flynn and seconded by Ron Asher to approve last voters meeting minutes as printed with last paragraph correction. It was noted that there was no second to Dr. Boettcher's amended motion at the bottom of the minutes. John Flynn amended motion to add a second. Motion approved

Budgets:

Board of Trustees budget presented by Ron Asher. He stated that there was no line item for snow removal. The budget had been \$1500 with only 4 snow days in the past. There was much discussion concerning snow removal. It was decided that \$6000 should be added as a line item of snow removal. Landscaping line had been left blank and it was decided to add \$2000 to that line item.

The sign on the northeast corner was discussed. Suggested it could be electronic which was \$20,000 bid given. It was suggested to go with cheaper way of using the letters. It was suggested to leave out the times of worship and leave name of church.

Flooring at the preschool was discussed and where we were with that item. Do we want to use dedicated funds or foundation funds or some other fund. Need a planning committee which is one member from each board and one member at large to help decide cost of repairs. Board of Education left 3 bids in the office. Those bids need to be found and given to the trustees and then bring results to church council. Betty Van Boening moved and seconded by Jim Parish to approve the Trustees budget to \$100,814 to include adjusting snow removal added of \$6000 and \$2000 added for landscaping. Motion carried.

BOOM budget. Suggested to change the name from Trunk or Treat line item changed to Events line item. Andrew Van Velson moved and seconded to change the name from Trunk or Treat to Events as presented and approved budget of \$26,000. Motion carried.

Board of Youth Budget was presented. Andrew Van Velson moved to approve budget same as last year, seconded by Betty Van Boening to approve budget of \$9,000. Motion carried.

Board of Education Budget: Happy with the teacher's aide position which has been vacant and decided to give a 3% raise. Historically tried to match the same percentages. Question asked as to how much Pre-school teacher is spending out of her own pocket. Brent Sinsel moved to adjust the raise from 3% to 5% for the teacher and teacher aide, seconded by Rebecca Sinsel. Motion carried with one descent. Last year an item of \$1000 for director added to further her education but was not included in the budget this year. Suggested to change line item for Pre-School Expense from \$3000 to \$4000 to add \$1000 for education. If more money is needed, it was suggested to go to another board and express more needs. One pre-school class is full, and the other class is almost full. The budget can be changed when needed. Glen Van Velson moved to raise staff salaries from 3% to 5% and seconded by Rebecca Sinsel to approve the board of education budget to \$55,423. Motion carried. Mike asked the voters to decide if we should have free tuition or not. There is an application for parents to apply for tuition assistance. It was suggested that we offer church members a discount on tuition. The cost for 24 students would be around \$20,000. Could there be a scholarship fund or fundraiser to be utilized. Betty Van Boening moved to put a committee together to decide whether there should be a scholarship fund, free tuition or congregation member discount and present findings to council in January, seconded by Rebecca Sinsel. Motion carried.

Board of Elders budget. Brent Sinsel moved and seconded by Betty Van Boening to approve increase of secretarial salary and treasurer salary to 5%. Motion carried.

There was discussion concerning the line item for sponsoring travel to the National Youth Gathering. Charlene Schneider presented a breakdown of what was received and spent last year for NYG. Total expense was \$22,546.11 last year. The youth are being sent as little missionaries and also work very hard when they get to the youth gathering. Andrew VanVelson moved to accept the Elders budget as presented with the 5% increase for Secretarial and Treasurer salaries for a total of \$280,131.00 seconded Rebecca Sinsel. Motion carried.

There was discussion concerning mailing out the newsletter only to the elderly. Suggested taking the newsletters to the church members who reside at Linden Court on the first Tuesday of each month. Moved and seconded to take newsletters to Linden Court on the first Tuesday of each month. Motion carried.

Discussion on the bell tower needing repair. Cheryl Schiel moved to fix the bell tower, seconded by Betty Van Boening. Motion carried.

Voters Mtg Continued...

By-laws need to be adjusted to a certain percentage for a quorum. Can't vote on the by-laws until we have a sufficient quorum. Do we want to lower the percentage of members for a quorum. Glen Van Velson has volunteered to update the language. After the by-laws have been updated, Glen recommended that we publish it 90 days or several Sundays before it is presented to the congregation to vote on.

Betty Van Boening moved and seconded by Ron Asher that we set up a call meeting on December 3rd so that we can call another pastor right away if Pastor Hahn declined our call. Motion amended to the correct to Sunday December 7th. Vote was by a show of hands with 18 yes and 9 no. Motion carried.

Closed with The Lord's Prayer

With no further business, meeting adjourned.
