## Introits

If you look at Psalms 120-134 in your Bibles, you will find that these are called the Psalms of Ascent. There are so many different types of Psalms, but these particular ones were used by believers as they journeyed to Jerusalem for the religious feasts. They sang along the way; they prayed along the way. As they walked, they talked with God. As they went, they brought His Word along the way.

The people of old in the Scriptures made use of the Scripture in their everyday lives and activities. And you can imagine the sight and the sound of this experience. As people were walking into Jerusalem from Jericho, they were singing. As they were journeying from Joppa to Jerusalem, they were singing the same songs. As they were riding from Nazareth into Jerusalem, they were praying the psalms with their families, their neighbors, and with all who went along that road.

And this is one of the main reasons that we hold so dearly to the Divine Service. For we travel from east and west and north and south, sometimes many miles away to come to this sanctuary, this temple of the Lord, and we sing the same songs. The young and the old sing the Gloria and the Offertory. The men and the women sing the Sanctus and the Agnus Dei. The children and the preachers sing the Nunc Dimittis and the Kyrie Eleison. Everybody is singing the same things about their God to their God. That is quite an experience.

And it is in this context that the Introit reflects the biblical practice in the Scriptures and connects us to the saints who have gone before us. For the Introit simply means in Latin, "Enter." And while it eventually marked the moment when the Pastor, the Crucifer, and the Acolyte, and other assistants entered into the sanctuary, we ought to consider it as the Psalm in which each family of our congregation enters in and joins with others in the unity of the faith.

And before I get ahead of myself, you have probably noticed that I sometimes include Latin titles for the various church services throughout the year. This is especially noticeable during Advent, Lent, and Easter. And these Latin phrases and words are simply the title of...you guessed it: the Introit. This Introit was so central to focusing the people on the point of the sermon and readings and hymns of that day that they called the Sunday by the name of the Introit.

We have probably lost something when we veer away from that practice. And we have probably lost something when we simply think of Psalm 22, and 23, and 24 instead of Psalm 22, the Introit for Good Friday, Psalm 23 the Introit for every funeral, and Psalm 24 as the Introit for the First Sunday in Advent.

Pastor Peterson cont.

I know that we all are used to speaking the Introit Psalm. But I want to challenge you to sing it, in a simple way, as one congregation, the collection of families that we are. And I know that we are used to having it follow the Confession and Absolution. I will discuss that in another newsletter article. But I do want you to notice what I do. I usually remain in the nave (pew area) until the Introit, and then I enter into the chancel (altar area).

It's a small thing, but it's a reminder of the pilgrimage of the saints in the Old Testament, of Jesus walking into Jerusalem in the New Testament, of the saints who have gone marching into sanctuaries for 2,000 years. It's something that unites us as believers to one another, that focuses our souls on the same Scriptures, and that prepares us for the eternal unison singing in the heavens at the feast that shall have no end.

Advertising will be placed in the back of the Sunday bulletins. The schedule for pulpit supply and other services that will be provided by Pastor Peterson was discussed. Some clarification on the Tuesday evening services was provided. One Tuesday of each month, Pastor Peterson meets with the other members of our circuit. Those meetings are typically in the mornings and Pastor Peterson intends to come to BSLC to serve those afternoons and evenings.

The first Tuesday evening meal and service will take place on August 19<sup>TH</sup>. The Elder's will be providing the meal that evening. Bonnie Van Cura has volunteered to coordinate the meal for the following Tuesday (August 26). Those two events will be evaluated, and future meals will be planned accordingly.

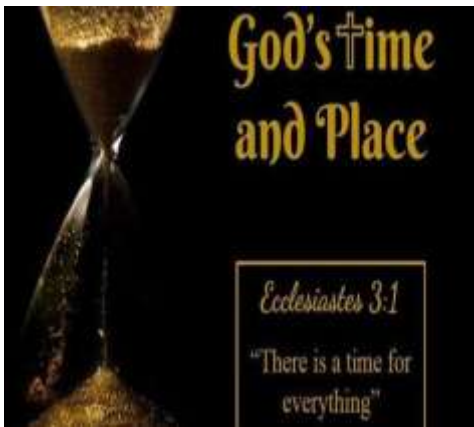

## LifeDate Fall 2025 – Life ... as We Age

God's Word tells us that it is a blessing to grow to an old age (Job 12:12; Proverbs 16:31, 17:6). However, because of sin, growing old also comes with many challenges. For many, aging means having to deal with a weakening and aching body, forgetfulness, and the loss of independence, among many other frustrations.

Unfortunately, the devil has convinced our culture to look to death as the solution to the suffering that comes with growing old. The story of Genesis 3 has been repeated over and over again as people elevate themselves to the place of God, who alone has authority over life and death. Ending one's own life through physician-assisted suicide or purposely hastening death by withholding necessary medications or treatments are violations of God's command to love and protect the lives He so wonderfully created.

It is right for a Christian to feel compassion for those who suffer and to desire an end to their pain. But deliberately ending a life is not the answer. Christ alone provides the answer to our suffering by joining Himself to our suffering in His own life and death.

For the sake of Christ, the heavenly Father leaves the aging with many wonderfully comforting promises. God will never leave us or forsake us, no matter how old we grow or how terribly we suffer (Isaiah 46:4; Psalm 138:9). He will use our suffering to strengthen our faith and bring us into His salvation (Romans 5:3-5, 8:28-30). And finally, by patiently enduring our suffering through the faith that He supplies, God will ultimately free us from all pain and suffering (Isaiah 25:8; Revelation 2:10).

It is my prayer for you that the articles in this issue will serve to that end. May your faith be increased so that in Christ our Lord, you are able both to see the sanctity that God places upon the lives of the aged and to entrust yourself into the loving care of our Father in heaven no matter what lies ahead, knowing that **“even to your old age I am he, and to gray hairs I will carry you.
