The January Feasts Circumcision and Name of Jesus 1/1/2026 Number 6:22-27, Galatians 3:23-29

While the world celebrates the New Year on January 1st, the Church celebrates the Circumcision and Name of Jesus on that day. And you might say, well why would we do that? And the answer is simple. We celebrate this day for Jesus just as we celebrate our baptism birthdays. So you celebrate the anniversary of you baptism? You should. I was baptized on October 25th, and every year I light the baptismal candle and read the baptism promises from the hymnal that were spoken on that day. I rejoice that I am baptized into Christ!

But celebrating this day goes even further than that. For it is on the 8th day of Jesus' life that He is brought to the temple, sacrifices are made for Him and His mother according to the purification laws of Leviticus, and that He is circumcised. That is, that Christ shed His blood, foreshadowing the whole and entire shedding of His blood on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins as He dies the Lamb of God for the salvation of all the earth. Christ was circumcised, as all of God's people were up to that point in history, in order to redeem all life and sanctify His life to make us holy people.

So on this feast, remember your baptism, and remember Christ sending His blood for you!

Confession of St. Peter—1/18/2026 Acts 4:8-13, 2 Peter 1:1-15, Mark 8:27-9:1

We Lutherans ought to celebrate the Confession of St. Peter every year. Why? Well because the Roman Catholics have boiled down the doctrine of the papacy to this exact event, and that was not the intent of the recording of this passage. In fact, each of our readings demonstrate the full breadth of Peter's confession.

The Roman Catholics focus on Matthew's retelling (Matthew 16), but we read Mark's Gospel that Peter helped him write. And Peter does not include the keys or the gates of hell that you find in Matthew. Jesus ask, **"Who do you say that I am? And Peter says, "You are the Christ."** Certainly we know that all the apostles confessed the same thing on that day in that way. This is not the institution of the pope, but the confession of the apostles, the same confession that each and every Christian confesses every Sunday in the Creeds.

And that's where the First Reading come into play. For there Peter is preaching in Acts 8 and he makes explicit what he means when he says, **"There is salvation in no one else (than Jesus),, for there is not other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."** Peter himself does think that he is standing in the place of Christ, but that salvation comes only through Christ.

As you read Peter's words, you realize 1) he was not a pope, and 2) he did not think that he alone had the keys to heaven. Rather, Peter points us to Jesus.

Let us celebrate the Confession of St. Peter to make the good confession to our brothers and sisters in the Roman Catholic church, but more importantly, let us make St. Peter's Confession our own confession of the truth, pointing all people to Jesus Christ, the Savior.

And so, as we prepare our hearts for this month of January, remember these days in our homes and emphasize these things to the families, always focusing on how this feast points us to Christ, in the remembrance of our baptism, in the shedding of Christ's blood, and in the confession that Jesus is the Christ, the Savior of the world in the flesh.

John Flynn moved that the meeting be closed. Larry Wallace seconded the motion.

Board of Trustee's Notes:



1. Automatic opener on the south of the church is being worked on.
2. Water fountain south side of church was leaking and has been repaired.
3. Work on a drywall defect at the thermostat upstairs is in progress.
4. The church insurance is concerned because groups are using the church, but not placing the meetings on the church calendar. The concern is that an injury or damage would not be covered by insurance if the meeting is not documented. This means that the group holding the meeting might be financially responsible for any damages or injuries. It is a simple process to get onto the church calendar by contacting the church secretary.
5. A similar church insurance concern is the use of the van by unauthorized drivers. The concern again is that any damage or injuries would not be covered by church insurance and the individuals who are driving would be financially responsible. If an unauthorized driver wishes to use the van, it is necessary to make proper arrangements.
6. At this time, there has been no change in contracted vendors for 2026.

Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh Stewardship Gifts

When we think of gifts, we think of Christmas. But when the Scriptures think of gifts, the authors think of Epiphany. The Epiphany season kicks off with the Gentile Wise Men coming to visit the Lord, and they bring gifts for Jesus' family.

This is one reason why it is common to have House Blessing services in our homes during this season. Just as the Wise Men visited the home where Joseph and Mary lived in order to bless the Holy Family, so also in many congregations, the pastor comes to visit and bless the homes of God's people as the new year begins.

But in that case, I don't usually bring gifts! I'll have to think about how I can incorporate that into future House Blessing services. But that is what the Wise Men do. They bring the very best that they have, just like you would present your best foods and drinks if the King, or in our case, the President came to visit your home. That is what the Wise Men are doing; they are acknowledging that King Jesus is greater than the king that they serve "in the east." They believe that Jesus is Lord of Lords and King of Kings.

And that is how we ought to orient our minds as well, that we are coming to church to visit our Lord, bringing the best that we have for Him to use for the sake of the ministry. We travel from east and west and north and south in order to hear about the life of Jesus and our life in Him.

And even the best that we give does not compare to the best that Christ gave, and that is perfectly ok. For Christ gave His life, as it says in the Small Catechism, "not with gold or silver, but with His holy precious blood and innocent suffering and death, that we would be His own (people)."

And that really is why we give our best to the Lord, not out of obligation of the Law, but out of the joy of our hearts and the faith that He has given to us. It is because of Jesus' death on the cross that we have far greater treasures than all that we accumulate here on this earth, namely, the treasure of eternal life and the forgiveness of sins.

Let us always be Wise Men, coming to visit our Lord in His home, giving our gifts in return for His gifts given to us.
