

your almighty Word, O Lord, descended from the royal throne.




# **Lighting of the Christ Candle**

P As we come this evening to the manger and kneel before the Christ child, God prepares our hearts as we confess our sins and receive His forgiveness.


#### **Confession of Sins**



<sup>14</sup>"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"






# **Apostles' Creed**




"Away in a Manger"
