In Search of Fulfillment

GENESIS 29



Genesis 29:15-35

1. What is Your Treasure?

- In Genesis 29, Jacob shifts his focus from God’s promises to pursuing Rachel. Do you believe there are Rachels today that draw people away from the pursuit of God? What are they?
- How do our treasures shape our priorities, emotions, and decisions?
- What do you personally find yourself tempted to treasure more than God?

2. Jacob & Leah: The Search for Fulfillment

- 1) What do Jacob and Leah hope will fulfill them? How were they disappointed?

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- 2) Can you relate to Leah's longing for approval or Jacob's pursuit of romantic fulfillment?
- 3) Pastor Chad mentioned that "in the morning, it will always be Leah." What do you think he meant, and have you experienced this truth in your own pursuits?
- 4) Has God ever used disappointment to redirect your heart toward Him or refine your life?

3. Only God Can Write the Best Part of Our Story

- Read **2 Corinthians 4:16-18**. What advice does Paul give to the church of Corinth? What two things does Paul contrast in these verses? What does this tell us about how we should be prioritizing our lives?
- Leah's turning point came when she gave birth to her final son and said, "This time I will praise the Lord" (vs. 35). What does this reveal about her spiritual maturity and surrender? What do you think changed in her heart?
- Read **Genesis 49:8, 2 Samuel 2:4 and Revelation 5:5**. What is significant about Leah's son Judah? How would God powerfully use Leah to bless the world?
- Read the following verses: **John 6:35, Matthew 11:28-29, John 8:36, 1 John 1:9, John 15:9, John 14:27, John 11:25-26, John 10:10**: How does Jesus and the gospel address our deepest longings and unmet needs?
- Pastor Chad mentioned, "Only God can generate the best part of my story." Do you agree? Why or why not?



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
