A Growing Church

Encounter Family, we have seen so many souls saved this past year, and countless new believers baptized. As we start our summer here at Encounter, I want us to take purposeful steps with the Holy Spirit and others to become like Jesus. In Acts 1 following Jesus' command to "GO" make disciples of all nations, Jesus tells his disciples to wait.

"Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit...But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Jesus knew that the disciples' purposeful steps to become more like Him and to go make disciples would be pointless without the power of the Holy Spirit. Our purposeful steps without the Holy Spirit are like going for a walk on a treadmill, lots of effort but getting nowhere. 

This past year we have witnessed hundreds of people from Jackson come together to experience the kindness of the Lord and hear the gospel message. We also witnessed the body of Christ grow in loving the community! Here is a glimpse of the outreach events we have done:

- With over 10 Interfaith Shelter fun night visits we have seen roughly six to 10 regular volunteers who have committed to making them continue!
- 5+ Interfaith Shelter Dinner Churches: 7 to 12 regular volunteers commit to that ministry and also roughly 10 salvations have taken place!
- THE BLOCK PARTY had roughly 30 volunteers help bring over 750 people on our property! We witnessed two to three new families attend EC because of the event!
- Encounter @ Lowry's Little Flock Farm had roughly 20 volunteers help over 700 enjoy the event and get exposed to EC!
- 5+ visits to RISE ABOVE has resulted in four volunteers committing their time monthly through the church and two volunteers committing their own time there outside of o visits!
- Go Skate Day at Nixon Skate Park had roughly 60 to 80 people in attendance who heard the gospel and about six volunteers helped make the event happen!
- We had two volunteers put together 20 Christ-centered Easter Baskets for the children who live at the Interfaith Shelter.
- Our weekly food pantry served roughly 2800 people this year. It could not be possible without eight committed volunteers who regularly serve. We have witnessed roughly three families call Encounter Church their home because of it!
- Encounter Church of Homer gathers weekly providing a home church for roughly 35 core people! Our Homer campus has 12 regular volunteers.
- Encounter Church of Homer has hosted an Easter Egg Hunt and given out 18 bikes and 20 backpacks to the community!

Kitchen Renovation

A team of about 12 volunteers, led by Andy Ragain, headed up the renovation of our kitchen. The team spent a combined 135+ hours tearing out the old kitchen and installing new items from tile, to cabinets, to sinks, and appliances. The project began in November and wrapped up in January and it came in under budget at \$15,000!

War Room

The War Room is a room dedicated to prayer during our services.

During the 2022-2023 year, the worship ministry was busy. We hosted four worship nights, helping people experience directed and poignant times of worship, fellowshipped with others, and learned new worship songs. Eight new volunteers have joined the band and vocal teams. We've met regularly on Sundays to lead the Encounter congregation in worship and met once a month for traditional services midweek. We've also started a worship planning team that helps plan elements for services.



In the technical ministry, we've been busy as well. We've done upgrades to the sound board, the streaming equipment, the projection system, our stage lighting, and the stage monitoring system. Two extra monitors have been added to the back of the sanctuary for the worship team and preacher to see lyrics and message notes all around the room. We had a company tune our sound system for a more quality and consistent sound throughout the sanctuary. Four new volunteers have been trained and joined the tech team. In addition, we've started a tech leadership team that helps direct our repairs and upgrades, and helps plan for the future. This past year we enlisted the help of the CSD Company and invested 33k into sound system improvements in the sanctuary.

On **Sunday mornings** we offer eKids Ministries for our 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. services. At the 9 a.m. service we have two rooms, preschool and school age. At the 11 a.m. service we have five rooms: infant, 2-3 year olds, 4-5 year olds, Kindergarten- 3rd graders, and 4th - 5th graders. We make Sunday mornings a great time by having time to play, grab a snack and get to know each other. We teach on several different topics so eKids are always learning about the gospel, such as What Is The Church, and WHO? Is The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit. We have had many new families attending eKids.

Our busiest Sunday was 106 kids.

Wednesday Nights:

Our eKids Wednesday Nights are a special time for our kids to learn the gospel as well as connect with each other. We serve dinner, have a study or devotional, then end it with time to play in the arcade, on the rock wall or find a friend to play a board game with.

Our most attended Wednesday Night was 49 kids.

eKids Outreach

Kids rotated through 4 classes and got to experience making crafts, an egg hunt, our arcade and Mrs. Lexie telling the Easter Story. We were blown away by the amount of families that came out.

Kidz Kamp 2022: 367 kids attended

This is a 3-day camp for kids 1st-6th grade. Our guest speakers, The Laflins, did an amazing job performing illusions and sharing the gospel. We had **196 respond to the salvation message!**

Not only do kids get to experience activities they might not otherwise have, but they get to hear a message that could change their lives forever.

Report of the Internal Auditing Committee For Fiscal Year May 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023 May 11, 2023

Meeting Attendees:

The audit committee met on May 11, 2023 to review the financial statements and documentation of Encounter Church for the fiscal year period of May 1, 2022 to April 30, 2023.

The committee's review focused on the following areas:

General Record Keeping Invoices / Check Request Payments – Emphasis on Business Card documentation District Assessment Missions Payroll Weekly Teller Reports and deposit records Bank Statements

Below is a brief discussion of the Committee's observations and findings:

General Record Keeping – Hardcopy documentation was filed in an appropriate manner allowing for the random review of all financial transactions.

Invoices / Check Requests – This year's sample of invoices/check requests focused entirely on Business Card transactions and documentation. These transactions are by far the most complicated and difficult to reconcile. Three Business Card statements were reviewed along with the documentation and approval process for Business Card transactions. Here are the major findings:

1) 10/4/22	Business Card \$9942.62	18 of 108 transactions were missing receipts 16.7%
2) 8/6/22	Business Card \$23,135.04	14 of 121 transactions were missing receipts 11.6%
3) 1/7/23	Business Card \$18,301.63	24 of 121 transactions were missing receipts 19.8%

There is a good methodology in place for staff accounting of business card transactions and assignment to the appropriate expense account. Each month, each staff member fills out a master spreadsheet listing individual transactions that they were responsible for and assigns the transaction to the appropriate expense account. However, overall 16% of the individual line item transactions were missing original receipts in the three statements that were sampled. It is the recommendation of the finance committee that greater emphasis be placed with staff to provide all receipts for business card transactions as part of their overall business card documentation.

All staff business card reports from the above samples were reviewed and approved by an appropriate staff member.

District Assessment – The committee validated that district assessment payments have been made accurately and timely.

Missions – The basis document for the Missions spending plan was reviewed. The committee reviewed several quarterly Missions payments and validated that the payment amounts were made in accordance with the Missions committee's monthly spending plan.

Payroll – The committee reviewed the approved salary basis documents which were effective June 1, 2022 and periodically adjusted as staff changes were made. As of January 1, 2022 the accounting firm Willis & Jurasek took over payroll processing duties for Encounter Church. A review of a recent payroll processed by Willis and Jurasek confirmed that salaries were being administered and paid correctly as compared to the basis document that Jon had on file.

Weekly Teller Reports and Deposits – Three weekly teller reports were randomly selected and reviewed. The teller statements were compared against bank deposit records and giving report. All three teller reports matched the bank deposits per the bank statements and the weekly giving report.

The committee also reviewed the process for reconciling on-line giving receipts and found this process to be accurate. Receipts to the online giving account are transferred to the main CNB Checking Account on a weekly basis. For financial statement purposes, the target month-end balance to remain in the online giving account is \$100, which is calculated on the last Monday of each month. Because we do not reconcile this account on a daily basis, the actual month-end online giving account balance may be higher than the stated \$100 month end target amount due to additional daily on-line deposits that accrue from the last Monday reconciliation to the end of the month.

Bank Statements – The committee did not formally review bank statements as part of the audit this year, because they have been included as part of the committee's monthly reviews of the financial statements throughout the past fiscal year. In its reviews, the committee looks at each of the three accounts (CNB Checking, online giving account and WIF Investment) has found them to be accurately reflected in the financial statements as reported in the Finance Committee meeting minutes from the past fiscal year.

The audit committee did not find any material defects in the financial statements, bank statements and other financial records for the fiscal year May 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023. It is the opinion of the

audit committee that the books and reports of the treasurer properly and accurately reflect the financial business of the church.

In addition, we sincerely express our appreciation to Jon Dowling for his faithful and dedicated work in this volunteer position as church treasurer this past year. He is a great asset to the ministry of Encounter Church.


