- 4. What is Luke conveying in writing "51 When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem"?

7. How do you handle rejection in your walk with Christ?

Read verses 57-62

8. The three men along the road...

Verses 57-58 – the first man expresses a readiness to follow. How does Jesus respond and why?

Verses 59-60 – The second man is called. How does he respond and how does Jesus confront his response? (Note: On this view his request was to stay at home until his father died.¹)
Verses 61-62 – The third man offers to follow Jesus (like the first man). What is his request and how does Jesus reply to his request?
plication Have you counted the cost in truly following Jesus? How?
How do you respond when following Jesus reveals *That following Jesus isn't what I thought it was going to be
*I can't just get around to my calling when it suits me
*That I can't keep looking back when Jesus is calling me forward
