Note: Where verses 10-12 speak of those who may reject Jesus, verses 13-14 speak of those who have already rejected Jesus.

9. How does verse 16 help believers to guard against personalizing the rejection of the Gospel?

10. How do these verses speak of rejoicing and humility?

11. How do you rejoice in Jesus' work without attempting to "take some of the credit"?

Corrie ten Boom was once asked if it was difficult for her to remain humble because of her ministry success. Her reply was simple, "When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday on the back of a donkey, and everyone was waving palm branches and throwing garments on the road, and singing praises, do you think that for one moment it ever entered the head of the donkey that any of that was for him?" She continued, "If I can be the donkey on which Jesus Christ rides . . . I give Him all the praise and all the honor."
