
Grace Leggett, daughter of Tyler and Christina Leggett, was baptized on Sunday, March 23rd.

From Pastor David


The Scriptures emphasize the importance of community and togetherness. God said "it is not good for man to dwell alone." While He was speaking of marriage, it does apply to the other relationships in our lives. I recently saw this outline and thought it well states the Biblical and common sense case for pursuing relationships with others.

1. We Are Made for Community

- **Genesis 2:18** "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."
- From the beginning, God designed people to be in relationships, not isolation.

2. Encouraging and Supporting One Another

- **Hebrews 10:24-25** "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging or
 - some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."



- **Ecclesiastes 4:9-10** "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up."
- Life is easier when people work together and support each other.

3. Unity in Christ

• 1 Corinthians 12:12-14 – "Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink."

The Church is described as one body with many members, emphasizing the need for unity among believers.

- Colossians 3:13-14 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."
- Love is the key to true unity and togetherness.

4. Serving One Another

- Galatians 6:2 "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."
- We are called to help and support each other in difficult times.
- Acts 2:42-47 Describes the early church as a community that shared everything, ate together, and supported each other in faith.

5. Hospitality and Kindness

- Romans 12:10 "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves."
- **Hebrews 13:2** "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it."

Conclusion

The Bible teaches that true community is built on love, humility, service, and unity. Whether in church, family, or friendships, believers are called to live in harmony, encourage one another, and work together for the glory of God. Building stronger community relationships takes intentionality, kindness, and consistency. Here are some practical ways, based on biblical principles, to strengthen your sense of community and togetherness:

1. Be Present and Engage Regularly

- **Hebrews 10:25** "Not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another."
- Make it a priority to attend church, community gatherings, or small groups.
- Regular interaction builds trust and deepens relationships.

2. Show Genuine Care and Love

- **Romans 12:10** "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves."
- Take time to listen to others, ask about their lives, and follow up on concerns.
- Small acts of kindness, such as sending a message, visiting, or lending a helping hand, strengthen bonds.

3. Serve Others and Carry Burdens

- Galatians 6:2 "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."
- Offer practical help when people are struggling—whether it's emotional, financial, or physical support.
- Volunteer in church or local community efforts.

4. Forgive and Pursue Peace

- **Colossians 3:13** "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone."
- Conflict is inevitable, but resolving it with grace and forgiveness strengthens relationships.
- Avoid gossip and negativity—focus on unity and peace.

5. Be Hospitable

- **Hebrews 13:2** "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers."
- Invite people over for meals, coffee, or just good conversation.
- Being welcoming and creating a warm atmosphere makes others feel valued.

6. Pray for and With Others

- **James 5:16** "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed."
- Ask people how you can pray for them and follow up.
- Pray together—there's power in community prayer.

7. Encourage and Uplift Others

- 1 Thessalonians 5:11 "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up."
- Speak words of encouragement, affirm others, and celebrate their successes.
- Be a source of hope and positivity.

8. Be Intentional About Building Relationships

- Make a habit of reaching out to new people and forming deeper friendships.
- Find ways to connect—join a ministry, participate in group activities, or engage in shared interests.

Final Thought

True community takes effort, but it's worth it. When we invest in relationships with love, patience, and service, we reflect God's design for unity.



Backpack Collection (May-July) As we near the end of the school year, the children are looking forward to summer vacation. The backpacks they used during the school year are still usable. We will be donating the backpacks along with the school supplies we collect in July to give out to Maumee Schools of struggling families with school aged children. If you would like to help with this ministry, look for the backpack box in the gathering space in mid-May to place the donated backpacks.

Meijers "Simply Give" program

This program, sponsored by Meijers on Conant Street, that helps stock our "God's Storehouse" food pantry and other food related ministries, is **March 30th until June 28th.** You can help. It's as easy as 1,2,3.

Pick up a red/blue "Simply Give" card from the display in the Gathering Space or one from a kiosk near the Meijers check out lines.

Take the card with you when you shop at Meijers and present it to the cashier. He/she will add your \$10 donation to your shopping total. That's it! Your \$10 donation will be tallied. You can donate each time you shop at Meijers, if you wish.

There is a Double Match day on **Saturday**, **June 14th**. If you donate on that day, your donation will be doubled and become \$30 instead of \$10. At the end of the program, St. Paul's will be given your monetary donations as well as Meijers donating to the total in the form of gift cards which we can use to restock the God's Storehouse.

Exploring God's word together allows our men's group to learn and grow with one another, to be challenged and encourage one another to live for something larger than ourselves.


