## **From Pastor David**

# Mosaic Ministries' Fall Banquet







Can you imagine the pressure a young pastor would feel being the grandson of Billy Graham? Everything you say and do would be compared to the great preacher. No matter how good you were, you would never rise to the level of your mom's dad.

This is the situation faced by a preacher who will be visiting Toledo soon. The pressures of his heritage were further compounded by the name he was saddled with, Tullian Tchividjian! His father, a clinical psychologist, was born in Switzerland but also from Armenian lineage.

Initially, Tullian got off to a great start, writing 8 books, starting a church which grew quickly, merging that church with a famous Presbyterian congregation and then replacing the legendary pastor, D. James Kennedy, of that congregation. Tullian was asked to appear on Fox News, 60 Minutes, the 700 Club and others. He won Christianity Today's Book of the Year award. He was quickly known for making profound statements on the grace of God.

Then, a decade ago, his world crumbled into dust. He failed to live up to his ministry standards, his marital vows and his own expectations. He crashed in a very public, very ugly way. The impact on his wife and 3 kids was severe. His church fired him, calling him "unfit for ministry." In pastoral terms, he was a colossal failure with zero reason to hope in a future.

However, we serve a God of second chances. Jesus was not done with Tullian. He returned to ministry after 4 years of recovery and has started a church and recovery ministry known as The Sanctuary, "focused on God's grace for the vulnerable and broken." Today, Tullian is still considered controversial in some fundamentalist circles. I think his story has a strong lesson for all of us. In the #MeToo era, we see hidden sins brought into the broad daylight. This is generally a good thing. But, our culture makes no allowances for forgiveness, reconciliation or restoration. This movement is all about punishment, not about grace. That is the special message at the heart of our faith in Christ. Only He can properly cleanse us and put our feet back upon the rock of our salvation. This is what He did with Peter who denied knowing Him. This is what Jesus did with Paul, who persecuted Christians. It is what God does with each of us who seek him.

Tullian will be the speaker at <u>Mosaic Ministries' Fall Banquet</u>. We hope you will join us, it is free and you can register here. Tullian will also be at St. Paul's earlier that afternoon to talk with pastors and ministry leaders about grace. We hope you might join us for the free dinner that night. Any St. Paul's member is welcome to join us that afternoon as well, details to follow.

# Jesus the Greatest Coach


I spent the last nine years of my life coaching Cross- Country and Track and Field. During that time, I developed a lot of slogans and phrases, as well as heard a lot from different coaches. I eventually developed a reputation as being the loudest coach in Central Illinois, and arguably the entire state. My athletes could hear my voice from a quarter mile away during Cross-Country.

When you think about loud voices, what comes to mind? Be honest, when you hear that your new Youth and Family Ministries Pastor was the loudest coach, how does that make you feel? Most of us have encountered a lot of very loud voices. Very few of these loud voices have a positive connotation.

My focus, though, was that I wanted to make sure that my athletes never doubted my confidence in them. Not only that, I wanted them to feel the support. I wanted them to look back in 10 years and be able to have a vivid memory of an adult voice speaking truth and love.

My favorite phrase to say was, "Believe in yourself as much as I believe in you!" You would be amazed how many kids were terrified of losing. They were terrified to fail. And when they approached competition that way, guess what: they failed. I had to train them to want to win more than they were afraid to lose.

What does all this have to do with Bible and theology though? I firmly believe that Jesus desires for us to listen to his voice and to believe it. When we do not know his voice, listen to it, and shut out all other noises, we can become like an athlete who starts looking over their shoulder when they feel tired, or an athlete that looks at the high jump bar and sees that it is over their head. Jesus, like a good coach, promises to give us the power and ability to do what He calls us to. That power is the same immeasurable power that rose Him from the grave!



Does this mean that I believe God is calling you to a life of unlimited money and success? Absolutely not! Does this mean that I think God is giving you the power to have your children always listen to you, or to have your spouse always agree? No and no! But it means that I believe God calls us to make disciples, bear fruit, and grow. If He brought you to the Greater Toledo Area, then that means He believes you can grow in love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. He might not make your kid listen, but He can give you the patience to parent. Listen to the voice of Jesus over all the noise. He believes you can do what He has called you to do. So, do it.

If you are shopping and think of it, buy two and donate one to God's Storehouse. We thank you, in advance, for your generosity!



Please bring your Bible. We will look forward to having you join us.






# APPLE OF HIS EYE


Start each school day by remembering God's loving care for you.

Answer: "Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings." Psalm 17:8, MIV






These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

#### What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)

#### What you do:

- 1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
- 2. Place apple slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
- 3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.


