#### <u>Pastor's Corner</u> September 2025

Dear Samaria Family,

Last month's newsletter addressed the beginnings of Baptists in Europe and America. September's newsletter will focus on early North Carolina Baptists. Beginning in 1878, Samaria has a long history as a "Great Commission Church", faithfully supporting missionaries and passionately desiring to share the Gospel and to see individuals accept Christ. To better understand the first Baptists in North Carolina, one must look to see God's

sovereign power moving in England.

In 1739, English evangelist, George Whitefield began the first of five preaching tours in the American colonies, resulting in the Great Awakening. Out of these revivals, a new group of Baptists emerged known as the Separate Baptists or New Lights, between 1744 and 1754. Four individuals, Isaac Backus, Shubal Stearns, Daniel Marshall, and Martha Sterns Marshall, left New England and eventually settled at Sandy Creek, North Carolina, near what is now Siler City in Randoph County. Shubal Stearns was born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1706. His family were members of the Congregational Church. He described his new North Carolina neighbors as, "a people almost destitute of religious privileges, but ready to listen to the earnest proclamation of the truth." In 1755, Stearns founded a Baptist church at Sandy Creek with sixteen charter members in a brush arbor. The first meeting house was built in 1762. By his death in 1771, the church had 606 members and had sent out 125 preachers and established forty-two other Separate Baptist churches and missions. Interestingly, Martha Stearns Marshall, Shubal's sister,

Interestingly, Martha Stearns Marshall, Shubal's sister, and her husband Daniel served as Presbyterian missionaries among a tribe of Mohawk Indians. Later the Marshalls joined the Baptist church. However, Martha became a controversial figure in some Baptist churches because she preached and prayed publicly. Historian, Robert Semple compared Martha to Priscilla in the Bible. Semple characterized Martha as "unwearied and zealous in co-operation as a helper with her husband." According to esteemed Baptist historian and Greek professor at Wake Forest College, Dr. George Washington Paschal, Stearns' influence has been immeasurable, eventually resulting in the establishment of thousands of Baptist churches including as "far west as the Mississippi River, southward to Georgia, eastward to the sea, and northward to the Potomac River." He organized the Sandy Creek Association, and it became the main hub for strategic evangelism according to the Baptist Encyclopedia. Wake Forest University historian, Henry S. Stroupe called the founding of Sandy Creek "the most significant landmark in North Carolina Baptist history in the eighteenth century." Historian Samuel S. Hill, writes that the Sandy Creek Baptists "were everywhere, it seemed, converting, revitalizing, and starting new Separate Baptist Churches." A North Carolina historic roadside marker reads, "Sandy Creek Baptist Church, Mother of Separate Baptist churches across the South. Founded by Shubal Stearns, 1755. His grave is two miles south."

As our church moves forward, may we always remember Matthew 28:19, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."
