Dear Family,

True leaders demonstrate emotional intelligence, rise above hostility, and lead with grace, wisdom, and compassion. Let us talk to, comfort, guide, and undergird our young people, showing them a way forward and speaking to their brokenness, fear, and rage, bringing them hope and healing.

So I'm asking you to pray for our city and region. Support one another. Speak out for what is right. Show kindness to those who are hurting. Be a living example that God's light still shines, even when the days feel dark.

As Scripture reminds us in Isaiah 1:17, "Learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause." This is our call, and this is our charge.

We love DC, and we believe in its people. Together, with God's help, we can protect its future, its freedom, and its most vulnerable.
