

January through July 2025 = 8,820 kits came in. 2,520 went out to East Africa; 4,284 went to storms and flooding in the USA south; 2,520 went to Venezuela; 1,260 went to Puerto Rico; 756 went to Guatemala.

NMI Central: News on South America Region—Argentina

August 27, 2025

Argentina is one of the once United Provinces of the Rio de la Plata, which in 1816 declared their independence from Spain. From the 1860s to the 1930s, Argentina was largely a nation of immigrant populations, referring to itself as a “crucible of races.” While the vast majority of the population claims to be Christian, most also admit that they do not practice their faith. The Church of the Nazarene entered Argentina in 1919, one of the earliest mission fields in South America. Passionate for missions, the churches in Argentina are thinking intergenerationally about how best to engage in God’s missions in their own country and around the world.

The Trustees would like to thank everyone for all the work that's been done over the summer.

Here's a recap of just some of it:

Gordon Ferno has been doing much of the maintenance around the buildings such as ensuring lights work (especially replacing battery packs in our emergency exit signs), fixing doors so they close properly, installing a blackout shade in the sanctuary, installing a variety of shelves, helping with the Children's Ministry move, and about a million other tasks that people probably don't see. He keeps an eye on the premises and fixes problems as soon as he sees them.

Tom Spaulding is our go-to plumber and HVAC tech and among other things has replaced the faucet in the ladies' room in the south building.

Keith Lowe and John Owens cover the electrical areas including re-wiring and installing new lighting.

Bob Bond took on the huge task of mowing our lawns all summer.

The MOTLEY Crew fixes and installs pretty much anything we need fixed or installed as part of their Tuesday gatherings.

Ron Boyd keeps an eagle eye on the buildings as well and has been a great organizer and planner for projects.

I've done a bunch of weed pulling and weed whacking and when needed, worked on removing carpet stains (sometimes successfully, sometimes not).

Pastor Eddie, when needing some quiet meditation time, loves pulling weeds, doing demolition and construction.

Paul Hanson and Patrick Riutta took huge loads of items to the dump/transfer stations during the Church Clean Up day.

We've had volunteers painting, working on demolition and construction for the Children's Ministry move to the south building and the work needed to the north building for the changes there. I even saw Kaleb helping his dad with demolition.

The Lowes and Fernos have been there working nearly every time I've been at the church and I know they're there many, many other times.

None of these jobs could be accomplished without the skills and hands of volunteers. I know there are many others who have helped that I don't even know about and want to extend a huge, heartfelt thank you to EVERYONE!
