

Who is my youth being led by for 2025–26?

Qualifications for one to be a direct weekly volunteer youth leader at Ebenezer Youth:

- Leader must be a follower of Jesus.
- Leader engages with Ebenezer Baptist Church outside of leadership with the youth.
- All leaders annually sign off on the BGC (our church denomination)
 'Statement of Faith', 'Marriage Statement', and the 'Ebenezer Youth Leader Lifestyle Agreement.'

Process of Application for a Leader at Ebenezer Youth:

- A potential leader must read the 'Ebenezer Youth Comprehensive Guide to Youth Leadership.'
- A potential leader must fill out the Ebenezer Youth Leadership application.
- -A potential leader must have an interview with the Jr/Sr Youth Pastor.
- A potential leader will give two references (one within the church and one outside of the church).
- A potential leader will then sign off in agreement to the 'BGC Statement of Faith', 'BGC Marriage Statement', and the 'Ebenezer Youth Leader Lifestyle Agreement.'
- A potential leader must do a Criminal Record Check and a Vulnerable Sector Check every 5 years.
- A leader must complete Ebenezer's Child Protection Policy.

Ongoing discipleship and leadership development for a leader at Ebenezer Youth:

- Youth life group leaders will get coaching from a youth life group coach.
- Youth ministry coordinators will get coaching from the youth coordinator director.

- Youth ministry managers/ directors will get coaching from the Youth Pastor
- Youth Pastor is coached by a Youth Ministry expert, has ongoing mentoring, and goes to counselling regularly
- All direct weekly leaders must attend an annual leadership training retreat before the fall kicks off at Ebenezer Youth to grow in their discipleship with Jesus, disciple-making to our youth, and in their youth leadership.
- YWC annual winter conference, our team at Ebenezer Youth will attend the YWC conference for further development
- All direct weekly leaders must attend Sunday lunch meetings every three months in our ministry year for ongoing discipleship and leadership training.
- All direct weekly leaders must attend a debrief day after our regular programming season.
- All direct weekly leaders are highly encouraged to attend an Ebenezer Equipping Seminar in the year to further their walk with Jesus and sharpen their leadership toolbox to disciple our youth.

Other strategic leadership team building:

- All direct weekly leaders are invited for a monthly leader hangout to foster connection as a team.
- All direct weekly leaders are invited to an Ebenezer Youth Leaders Christmas party.

Cost of Ebenezer Youth 2025-26

Ebenezer Youth is the youth ministry of Ebenezer Baptist Church, and we can graciously run almost all of our programs/events at no cost to our community and church family through the generosity of those in the Ebenezer church family who fuel God's mission here at Ebenezer Youth.

However, some retreats/mission trips cost a substantial amount of money, so we need to ask for payment for them. For 2025-26, here is what we expect events to cost for Ebenezer Youth:

1. 2025 Ebenezer Youth Fall Retreat

- Our 2024 Fall Youth Retreat is available for youth in grades 6-12 and will cost \$189 this year

This fall retreat will take place at The Quest at Christopher Lake from September 26 to 28, 2025.

2. SOAR SASK 2026

- SOAR SASK is available for youth in grades 7-12, and this year, as a team, we will be fundraising together once again (meaning there is no individual payment required.)
- This mission trip will be taking place February 13-20 2026 in Saskatoon SK

As our youth ministry continues to increase in size, we need more financial assistance for these types of events. Like last year, we are going to set up a sponsorship program for youth who hope to attend the retreat but cannot afford the cost. Intermediates:

 At Intermediates, we have the goal of having our youth survey/ work through all 66 books of the Bible before they hit grade 7. This aims to be a deep work of spiritual formation/ catechesis that allows our youth to be fully ready for their middle and high school years. Every week is designed to teach our youth that the Bible is a unified story that leads to Jesus. One year we will have an Old Testament focus and the next will have a New Testament focus.

The Huddle:

 At The Huddle, we turn our questions from our Q&R into content so that our youth can have the space to answer these questions in depth weekly. This can build faith in the most challenging questions one faces every day, but may not have a space to ask.

Morning Bible Study:

 At our Morning Bible Study, we will study one book of the Bible at a time, working through one chapter each week. We will have an intentional study time to reflect and grow in the way of Jesus, starting our weeks off on the right foot and instilling healthy Bible study habits.

Commissioned:

 At Commissioned, we aim to equip our grade 11–12 youth to figure out their vocation and what God may be calling them to do for the rest of their life.
 This is done through biblical study on vocation, spiritual gifts tests, and discernment conversations.

L.I.T program:

 At our Leadership in Training program, we seek to develop young potential leaders to step into leading through serving and giving back. Training includes biblical leadership study, active 'on-the-job' training in serving responsibilities, and intentional development and mentoring towards being a leader in given opportunities and roles.
