Dear Lynnewood Family,

It has been a few months since I last reported on our financial status. Two things jump out from the above chart:

- (1) You have been exceedingly generous, esp. in your giving towards the LA Fire Relief (bulk of outreach giving in February and March).
- (2) Donation income has not kept up with expenses. Donation income covers items such as salaries, program expenses, insurance, maintenance, utilities, etc. In the first quarter, we do get some annual expenses such as insurance and the first property tax payment. That accounts for the bulk of our 1st quarter shortfall.

In closing, THANK YOU for your continued generosity and I encourage you to be regular in your giving to the general expenses of Lynnewood. Please help us to continue to provide meaningful worship, programs and outreach to the community.


