## **SCRIPTURES:**

1 Corinthians 15

## **DIGGING DEEPER:**

- **1.** Paul said, "I want to make clear for you." If Paul felt the responsibility to make the gospel clear to others why do we feel no responsibility to share the gospel with those closest to us?
- **2.** Paul describes salvation as something we are "being saved" by if we "hold to the message." How does this truth challenge the common "one-and-done" view of salvation in our culture? What does it practically look like to "keep holding to the gospel" every day?
- **3.** "Conversion isn't the end, it's actually the beginning." What are some clear signs that a person is *being transformed by the gospel* not just professing it? How do we guard against complacency in our own walk with Jesus?
- 4. When did you hear, believe, and understand your need for the gospel?
- **5.** Paul said, "By the grace of God I am what I am... yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me." How have you seen God's grace not only save you but shape and strengthen you to serve?
- **6.** The Corinthian church allowed cultural thinking (like Plato's view of the body) to distort gospel truth. Where do you see *today's culture* shaping the church's message or priorities in similar ways? How can believers stay faithful to truth while living in such a persuasive culture?
- **7.** Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised…" then everything falls apart. Why is the resurrection the non-negotiable foundation of our faith? How does the resurrection give you hope in moments of loss, doubt, or discouragement?
