- Asaph's duties are described in detail in 1 Chronicles 16.
- Asaph was a skilled musician and prophet or seer (2 Chronicles 29:30).
- The sons of Asaph were likely a guild of skilled poets and singers, modeling themselves musically after Asaph, their master. (1 Chronicles 25:1, 2 Chronicles 20:14, and Ezra 2:41)
- The Levite Jeduthun means "lauder" or "praising" was one of David's chief musicians (1 Chronicles 16:41–42; 2 Chronicles 35:15; Psalm 39:1).
- Another choir director mentioned in the Psalms and 1 Chronicles was Heman.
- Several psalms were designated for each of these three directors, which may indicate that each specialized in a different kind of music. Psalms 39, 62, and 77 are assigned to Jeduthun, indicating that his choir or musicians were to lead the congregation on those songs.

For Jeduthun, the choir director: A psalm of Asaph.

Psalm 77:1 I cry out to God; yes, I shout. Oh, that God would listen to me! **2** When I was in deep trouble, I searched for the Lord. All night long I prayed, with hands lifted toward heaven, but my soul was not comforted. **3** I think of God, and I moan, overwhelmed with longing for his help.

4 You don't let me sleep. I am too distressed even to pray! **5** I think of the good old days, long since ended, **6** when my nights were filled with joyful songs. I search my soul and ponder the difference now. **7** Has the Lord rejected me forever? Will he never again be kind to me? **8** Is his unfailing love gone forever? Have his promises permanently failed? **9** Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has he slammed the door on his compassion?

10 And I said, "This is my fate; the Most High has turned his hand against me." 11 But then I recall all you have done, O Lord; I remember your wonderful deeds of long ago. 12 They are constantly in my thoughts. I cannot stop thinking about your mighty works. 13 O God, your ways are holy. Is there any god as mighty as you? 14 You are the God of great wonders! You demonstrate your awesome power among the nations. 15 By your strong arm, you redeemed your people, the descendants of Jacob and Joseph.

16 When the Red Sea saw you, O God, its waters looked and trembled! The sea quaked to its very depths. 17 The clouds poured down rain; the thunder rumbled in the sky. Your arrows of lightning flashed. 18 Your thunder roared from the whirlwind; the lightning lit up the world! The earth trembled and shook.
19 Your road led through the sea, your pathway through the mighty waters—a pathway no one knew was there! 20 You led your people along that road like a flock of sheep, with Moses and Aaron as their shepherds. (*NLT*)

Psalm 40:1 I waited patiently for the Lord to help me, and he turned to me and heard my cry. **2** He lifted me out of the pit of despair, out of the mud and the mire. He set my feet on solid ground and steadied me as I walked along. **3** He has given me a new song to sing, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see what he has done and be amazed. They will put their trust in the Lord. **4** Oh, the joys of those who trust the Lord, who have no confidence in the proud or in those who worship idols. (*NLT*)
