



Uses for Easy Fact Sheets

Our fact sheets have so many uses that they ought to be considered a staple in every Sunday school closet! Here are just some ways to use them:

- * before you teach a lesson on one of them in the Bible;
- * during lessons if students look confused about who a character is;
- * as a lesson pack in and of themselves, using three or four fact sheets a week until complete;
- * as great fill-in material for substitute teachers
- * as introductory and/or closing activities for class
- * as fill-in time material if you finish a lesson too soon!

Further Ideas for Use & Game Ideas

The fact sheets are just that-fact sheets. However, there are Bible lookups on each page, and games you can play with them as follows:

Guess Which Hero: Put the list of personalities, from either the Table of Contents or above, in plain sight. Start reading from a page, avoiding the character's name. The student who can guess the person correctly first gets a point. The student with the highest score at the game's end wins!


Who Came First Race: It's hard to understand history if you don't know when things happened. To help students get a great timeline going in their heads, make a copy of the sheets and cut out just the top information: name and dates. Cut off the number or you will give it away. Have students race to get all the Bible personalities in order chronologically based on the BC and AD dates.

Who Said That: Just read from the Bible character's quotes and have students guess who said it for points or prizes.

True or False: This is great if students are studying one worksheet at a time. It will reinforce all the material. Just take a sheet they are becoming familiar with, and either read a question or pretend to be reading and say the opposite. Students must guess whether the material you just presented was true or false.





CLAIMS TO FAME:

- Noah built the ark
- 2 He led his wife, three sons, and their wives through the flood, approximately 2304 BC.
- 3 He is the father of all of us, being the father of the surviving sons of the flood.
- Noah had three sons: Shem, Japheth, and Ham

FAMOUS QUOTES:

"They were eating and drinking and marrying and being given in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and the flood came and destroyed them all." *Jesus, Luke 17:27*

CHILDHOOD:

- Abraham's family was from Ur, a very influential city in Mesopotamia.
- His father, Terah, took the family north to Harran, which is where God spoke to him about moving to Canaan to become a great nation.





MARRIED: SARAH

- Abraham married Sarah, who gave birth to his famous son Isaac.
- He also had another child, Ishmael, with Sarah's servant Hagar. It is believed that Ishmael's descendants became the people of Islam, while Isaac's descendants became the people of Israel.
- Abraham also married Keturah, and had several children with her. But he left his entire estate to Isaac.

Birth of Jesus

Birth: Approx. 2166 BC

Death: Approx. 1991 BC

CLAIMS TO FAME:

- 1 Abraham became father of Isaac, even though his wife was 90 and he was 100.
- 2 Abraham obeyed God when asked to sacrifice his son Isaac, only to have God intervene and provide a ram as a substitute.


FAMOUS QUOTES:




- God physically passed behind Moses causing him to glow bright white.





CLAIMS TO FAME:

- Saul was the first King of Israel.
- Saul began his reign as God's willing servant. But he became corrupt as time wore on. He became jealous of David after he slayed Goliath and sought to kill him.
- 3 He died in the battle of Gilboa, where Israel's army was fighting against the Philistines. He fell on his sword to prevent the enemy from capturing him alive, and his three sons were killed earlier that day.

FAMOUS QUOTES:

- "But am I not a Benjamite, from the smallest tribe of Israel, and is not my clan the least of all the clans of the tribe of Benjamin? Why do you say such a thing to me?" 1 Samuel 9:21 (to Samuel, who was trying to anoint him king)
- "You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth." 1 Samuel 17:33 (to David when he wanted to fight Goliath)

CHILDHOOD:

- Fought and killed the giant Goliath as a teenager
- Was anointed as a future king of Israel by the great prophet Samuel





MARRIED:

- Michal, daughter of King Saul
- Abigail, widow of a foolish man who died after refusing to give David and his men food
- Bathsheba, with whom he had an illicit relationship and had to repent. (Their son was Solomon, who became the next king.)
- He had other wives and concubines, as polygamy was acceptable in that culture.

2000's AD

Birth: 1041 BC

Death: 971 BC

CLAIMS TO FAME:

- 1 Reigned as the second King of Israel from 1011 BC - 971 BC (40 years)
- 2 Was considered the greatest king of Israel
- 3 Conquered and founded Jerusalem
- Wrote more than 70 of the Psalms

FAMOUS QUOTES:


"Yeah, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for thou art with me." *Psalm 23:4*





- Ahab married Jezebel, daughter of a Siboan King, who worshipped the false god Baal and was killing God's prophets.


"There was never anyone like Ahab, who sold himself to do evil in the eyes of the Lord, urged on by Jezebel his wife. He behaved in the vilest manner by going after idols, like the Amorites the Lord drove out before Israel." 1 Kings 21:25-26

Ahab said to Elijah, "So you have found me, my enemy!" "I have found you," he [Elijah] answered, "because you have sold yourself to do evil in the eyes of the Lord. He says, 'I am going to bring disaster on you. I will wipe out your descendants and cut off from Ahab every last male in Israel-slave or free. I will make your house like that of Jeroboam son of Nebat and that of Baasha son of Ahijah, because you have aroused my anger and have caused Israel to sin.' 1 Kings 21:20-21, one of the brutal exchanges between Elijah and Ahab (and his wife Jezebel)

"And also concerning Jezebel the Lord says: 'Dogs will devour Jezebel by the wall of Jezreel." a Prophecy of God through Elijah, 2 Kings 9:30-37


Jezebel died as the prophet Elijah predicted. She was thrown off a tower and devoured by dogs so that most of her body could not be found or buried.







CHILDHOOD:

- Jesus was born in a manger in Bethlehem.
- Jesus lived in Egypt for a while as a child.
- While he was a baby or toddler, Jesus was visited by several astronomers, able to track him by the appearance of a star or star cluster. They brought him gifts and worshipped him.
- Jesus got separated from his parents around the age of 12 during a festival of the Passover in Jerusalem. It took his parents three days to find him in the temple, learning and perhaps teaching.



2000's AD

Death: Approx. 25 AD

CLAIMS TO FAME:

- **1** Jesus is our Savior and Messiah.
- 2 Jesus died on the cross as a sacrifice for our sinfulness.

"God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever should believe in him should not perish, but have eternal life." *John 3:16*

"I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me will live, even though he dies." *John 11:25*

CHILDHOOD:

It is believed by many that Mary was still in her teens when she was visited by the Angel Gabriel to tell her she would conceive Christ through the Holy Spirit.





MARRIED: JOSEPH

- Mary was betrothed to Joseph (which is similar to our being engaged), when she conceived by the Holy Spirit, as the angel Gabriel predicted to her.
- Joseph married her, though he was skeptical of her pregnancy, until God showed him in a dream Mary was telling the truth about having not cheated.

Birth of Jesus

Birth: Approx. 25 BC

2000's AD

Death: Unknown; there is no Biblical record of Mary after she approached Jesus on the Cross with John the Apostle.

CLAIMS TO FAME:

 Mary is mother of the Messiah, who conceived by the Holy Spirit. FAMOUS QUOTES:


"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her. *Luke 1:38*

- 2 Joseph saved the family from destruction by following an angel's advice and fleeing with them to Egypt. They stayed there until the death of Herod.


